2	relating to pathology reports on abortions; providing a penalty.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 170, Health and Safety Code, is amended
5	by adding Subchapter B to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER B. PATHOLOGY REPORTING REQUIREMENTS
7	Sec. 170.051. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. (a) The operator of
8	a facility at which an abortion is performed shall submit a
9	pathology report to the department on each abortion performed at
10	the facility.
11	(b) The report must be submitted on a form provided by the
12	department.
13	Sec. 170.052. PATHOLOGY REPORT. The pathology report
14	required by Section 170.051 must include:
15	(1) the name, title, and license number, if
16	applicable, of the person performing the pathology examination;
17	(2) the name and mailing address of the facility where
18	the pathology examination was performed;
19	(3) the date of the pathology examination and the date
20	of abortion;
21	(4) the pathology examination findings, including
22	gestational age of the fetus, absence of pregnancy, live birth, and
23	viability, and evidence of the findings; and
24	(5) the date the form is submitted.

- 1 Sec. 170.053. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION. All information
- 2 held by the department under this subchapter is confidential and
- 3 not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code. The
- 4 information may not be released or made public on subpoena or
- 5 otherwise, except that release may be made:
- 6 (1) for statistical purposes, but only if a person,
- 7 patient, physician, or facility is not identified;
- 8 (2) with the consent of each person, patient,
- 9 physician, and facility identified in the information released;
- 10 (3) to appropriate state licensing boards to enforce
- 11 state licensing laws; or
- 12 (4) to appropriate federal agencies, such as the
- 13 <u>Centers for Disease Control of the United States Public Health</u>
- 14 Service.
- Sec. 170.054. CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) A person commits an
- offense if the person violates Section 170.051.
- 17 (b) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
- SECTION 2. Sections 170.001 and 170.002, Health and Safety
- 19 Code, are redesignated as Subchapter A, Chapter 170, Health and
- 20 Safety Code, and a heading for Subchapter A is added to read as
- 21 follows:
- 22 <u>SUBCHAPTER A. PROHIBITED ACTS RELATING TO ABORTION</u>
- 23 SECTION 3. The chapter heading of Chapter 170, Health and
- 24 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 25 CHAPTER 170. [PROHIBITED ACTS REGARDING] ABORTION
- 26 SECTION 4. The Texas Department of Health shall develop and
- 27 make available the form required by Section 170.051, Health and

- 1 Safety Code, as added by this Act, not later than December 1, 2003.
- 2 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and
- 3 applies only to an abortion performed on or after January 1, 2004.
