- 10 (2) \underline{a} county \underline{jailer} [$\underline{jailers}$] as defined by Section
- 11 1701.001, Occupations Code;
- 12 (3) <u>an employee [employees]</u> of the Texas Department of
- 13 Criminal Justice; [and]
- 14 (4) a commissioned security officer [officers] as
- defined by Section 1702.002, Occupations Code; and
- 16 (5) a victim of family violence as defined by Section
- 17 71.004, Family Code, if as a result of the act of family violence
- 18 against the victim, the actor is convicted of a felony or a Class A
- 19 <u>misdemeanor</u>.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
