 named individual to whom this section applies; and

3 (2) the individual chooses to restrict public access 4 to the information on the form prescribed for that purpose by the 5 comptroller under Section 5.07.

6 (c) A choice made under Subsection (b) remains valid until
7 rescinded in writing by the individual.

8 (d) This section does not prohibit the public disclosure of 9 information in appraisal records that identifies property 10 according to an address if the information does not identify an 11 individual who has made an election under Subsection (b) in 12 connection with the individual's address.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
