1-7 AN ACT

1-8 relating to the confidentiality of certain home address information
1-9 held by a tax appraisal district.

1-10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-11 SECTION 1. Section 25.025(a), Tax Code, is amended to read
1-12 as follows:

1-13 (a) This section applies only to:

1-14 (1) a peace officer [~~officers~~] as defined by Article
1-15 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure;

1-16 (2) a county jailer [~~jailers~~] as defined by Section
1-17 1701.001, Occupations Code;

1-18 (3) an employee [~~employees~~] of the Texas Department of
1-19 Criminal Justice; [~~and~~]

1-20 (4) a commissioned security officer [~~officers~~] as
1-21 defined by Section 1702.002, Occupations Code; and

1-22 (5) a victim of family violence as defined by Section
1-23 71.004, Family Code, if as a result of the act of family violence
1-24 against the victim, the actor is convicted of a felony or a Class A
1-25 misdemeanor.

1-26 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
1-27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
1-28 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
1-29 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
1-30 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.

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
