2	relating to individual transition plans for certain students
3	receiving special education services.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 29.011(a), Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	[(a)] The commissioner [Texas Education Agency, the Texas
8	Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, and the Texas
9	Rehabilitation Commission] shall [develop, agree to, and] by rule
10	adopt procedures for compliance with federal requirements relating
11	to transition [a memorandum of understanding that establishes the
12	respective responsibilities of each agency for the provision of]
13	services <u>for</u> [necessary to prepare] students <u>who are</u> enrolled in
14	special education programs <u>under this subchapter</u> [for a successful
15	transition to life outside of the public school system]. The
16	procedures must specify the manner in which a student's admission,
17	review, and dismissal committee must consider, and if appropriate,
18	address the following issues in the student's individualized
19	education program:
20	(1) appropriate student involvement in the student's
21	transition to life outside the public school system;
22	(2) if the student is younger than 18 years of age,
23	appropriate parental involvement in the student's transition;
24	(3) if the student is at least 18 years of age,

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appropriate parental involvement in the student's transition, if 1 2 the parent is invited to participate by the student or the school district in which the student is enrolled; 3 4 (4) any postsecondary education options; 5 (5) a functional vocational evaluation; 6 (6) employment goals and objectives; 7 (7) if the student is at least 18 years of age, the 8 availability of age-appropriate instructional environments; 9 (8) independent living goals and objectives; and (9) appropriate circumstances for referring a student 10 or the student's parents to a governmental agency for services. 11 SECTION 2. Sections 29.011(b)-(e), Education Code, 12 are repealed. 13 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2003-2004 14 15 school year. SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2003. 20

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
