- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Sections 61.012(a) and (c), Human Resources

 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) The governing board of the Texas Youth Commission
- 7 consists of five [six] members appointed by the governor with the
- 8 consent of the senate. Appointments to the board shall be made
- 9 without regard to the race, color, disability, sex, religion, age,
- 10 or national origin of the appointees.
- 11 (c) The board members hold office for staggered terms of six
- 12 years, with the terms of either one or two members expiring every
- 13 two years.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 61.020, Human Resources Code, is amended
- 15 to read as follows:
- Sec. 61.020. SUNSET PROVISION. The Texas Youth Commission
- 17 is subject to Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset Act).
- 18 Unless continued in existence as provided by that chapter, the
- 19 commission is abolished and this chapter expires September 1, 2011

- 21 SECTION 3. Section 61.0812, Human Resources Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 61.0812. TREATMENT FOR SUBSTANCE ABUSE. (a) The
- 24 [Subject to an express appropriation to fund the treatment programs

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- 1 required by this section, the] commission may not release a child
- 2 under supervision or parole a child if:
- 3 (1) the child has a substance abuse problem, including
- 4 the use of a controlled substance, hazardous inhalable substances,
- 5 or alcohol habitually; and
- 6 (2) the child has not completed a treatment program
- 7 for the problem.
- 8 (b) The commission may release a child described by
- 9 Subsection (a) to the child's parent if the parent intends to enroll
- the child in a treatment program for the substance abuse problem.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
