A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the authority of the Texas Department of Transportation
- 3 to contract for the erection and maintenance of specific
- 4 information logo signs, major shopping area guide signs, and major
- 5 agricultural interest signs.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 391.091, Transportation Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:

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- 9 Sec. 391.091. ERECTION AND MAINTENANCE OF SIGNS. (a) The
- 10 department [commission] shall contract with an individual, firm,
- 11 group, or association in this state to erect and maintain specific
- 12 information logo signs, major shopping area guide signs, and major
- 13 <u>agricultural interest signs</u> at appropriate locations along an
- 14 eligible highway.
- 15 (b) The department may enter into a contract under this
- 16 section by the method that the department determines is the most
- 17 practical or most advantageous for the state, including competitive
- bids, competitive sealed proposals, and open market contracts.
- 19 (c) The department shall make a written award of a contract
- 20 to the offeror whose proposal offers the best value for the state.
- 21 <u>In determining the best value for the state, the department may</u>
- 22 consider:
- 23 (1) revenue provided to the department by the
- 24 contractor;

- 1 (2) fees to be charged eligible businesses or 2 agricultural interests for inclusion on the signs;
- 3 (3) the quality of services offered;
- 4 (4) the contractor's financial resources and ability
- 5 to perform; and
- 6 (5) any other factor the department considers
- 7 <u>relevant.</u>
- 8 (d) To the extent of any conflict, this section prevails
- 9 over any other law relating to the method of the purchasing of goods
- 10 and services by the department.
- 11 (e) Subtitle D, Title 10, Government Code, and Chapter 223
- do not apply to purchases of goods and services under this section.
- SECTION 2. Section 201.112(a), Transportation Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 (a) The commission may by rule establish procedures for the
- 16 informal resolution of a claim arising out of a contract described
- 17 by:
- 18 (1) Section 22.018;
- 19 (2) Chapter 223; [or]
- 20 (3) Chapter 2254, Government Code; or
- 21 <u>(4) Section 391.091</u>.
- SECTION 3. Sections 391.097(b) and (c), Transportation
- 23 Code, are repealed.
- 24 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 25 to a contract entered into by the Texas Department of
- 26 Transportation on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 27 contract entered into by the Texas Transportation Commission before

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- 1 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law as it existed
- 2 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former
- 3 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 4 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
