9	TECHNOLOGY TRAINING. (a) In this section, "Texas-Mexico border

12	(b) The commission by rule may establish and implement a
13	pilot program in the Texas-Mexico border region under which the
14	commission may competitively procure adult technology training for
15	residents of the state who are workers displaced as a result of
16	trade dislocations or other changes in the state economy.
17	(c) If the commission establishes a pilot program under this
18	section, the commission may:

20	(A) existing state-funded technology

11	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
12	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

15	Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
