- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 206.203(b), Occupations Code, is amended 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (b) In addition to meeting the requirements of Subsection 7 (a), a person must:
- 8 (1) pass the examination required by Section 206.204;
- 9 (2) hold at least an associate's degree based on 10 completion of an educational program that is substantially 11 equivalent to the education required for a registered nurse or
- 12 physician assistant who specializes in surgical assisting;
- 13 (3) demonstrate to the satisfaction of the medical
- 14 board the completion of full-time work experience performed in this
- 15 country under the direct supervision of a physician licensed in
- 16 this country and consisting of at least 1,200 [2,000] hours of
- 17 performance as an assistant in surgical procedures for the three
- 18 years preceding the date of application; and
- 19 (4) possess a current certification by a national
- 20 certifying body approved by the medical board.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 206.205, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 22 amending Subsections (b) and (c) and adding Subsection (d) to read
- 23 as follows:
- 24 (b) A person who is otherwise eligible for a license under

- 1 Section 206.203 is not required to meet the educational
- 2 requirements under Section 206.203(b)(2) if:
- $\underline{\text{(1)}}$  the person applies for a license under this
- 4 section before September 1, 2002, and:
- 5 (A)  $\left[\frac{(1)}{(1)}\right]$  will complete before the third
- 6 anniversary of the date the license is issued under this
- 7 <u>subdivision</u> [subsection] the following academic courses approved
- 8 by the medical board:
- 9 (i)  $\left[\frac{\langle A \rangle}{\langle A \rangle}\right]$  anatomy;
- 10 <u>(ii)</u> [<del>(B)</del>] physiology;
- 11 (iii) [<del>(C)</del>] basic pharmacology;
- 12 (iv) [<del>(D)</del>] aseptic techniques;
- 13  $\underline{\text{(v)}}$  [<del>(E)</del>] operative procedures;
- (vi) [(F)] chemistry; and
- 15  $\underline{\text{(vii)}}$  [<del>(C)</del>] microbiology; or
- (B)  $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$  has been continuously certified since
- 17 September 30, 1995, as a surgical assistant by a national
- 18 certifying body approved by the medical board and has practiced
- 19 full-time as a surgical assistant under the direct supervision of a
- 20 physician licensed in this country; or
- 21 (2) the person applies for a license under this
- 22 section before September 1, 2007, holds at least an associate's
- 23 degree, and:
- 24 (A) has successfully completed academic courses
- 25 approved by the medical board in anatomy, physiology, basic
- 26 pharmacology, chemistry, and microbiology and clinical instruction
- 27 approved by the medical board in aseptic techniques and operative

- 2 (B) has graduated from a surgical assistant
- 3 program approved by the board.
- 4 (c) A license issued under Subsection (b)(1) may not be
- 5 renewed after the third anniversary of the date of issuance unless
- 6 the license holder completes the academic courses described by
- 7 Subsection (b) (1) (A)  $[\frac{(b)(1)}{1}]$ .
- 8 (d) The medical board may approve:
- 9 (1) academic courses and clinical instruction under
- 10 Subsection (b)(2)(A) only if the courses or instruction meet or
- 11 exceed the standards adopted by the Commission on Accreditation of
- 12 Allied Health Education Programs; and
- (2) a surgical assistant program under Subsection
- 14 (b)(2)(B) only if the program:
- 15 (A) is recognized and accredited by the
- 16 Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs; or
- 17 (B) has educational standards that are
- 18 equivalent to or exceed the standards adopted by the Commission on
- 19 Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs.
- SECTION 3. Section 206.210(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- 22 (a) A surgical assistant license expires on the second
- 23 <u>anniversary of the date of issuance.</u> The medical board by rule
- 24 shall provide for the [annual] renewal of a surgical assistant
- 25 license.
- SECTION 4. Subchapter F, Chapter 206, Occupations Code, is
- amended by adding Section 206.2525 to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 206.2525. REIMBURSEMENT FOR SERVICES. (a) This
- 2 chapter does not limit the way in which a surgical assistant
- 3 licensed under this chapter may be reimbursed for services.
- 4 (b) A surgical assistant licensed under this chapter may
- 5 <u>directly bill a patient or third-party payor for services provided</u>
- 6 by the surgical assistant.
- 7 SECTION 5. (a) This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
- 8 (b) Section 206.210(a), Occupations Code, as amended by
- 9 this Act, applies only to the expiration of an original or renewal
- 10 license that is issued on or after the effective date of this Act.
