## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT 1 2 relating to information provided to parents of newborn children 3 relating to immunizations. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 161, Health and Safety 5 6 Code, is amended by adding Section 161.0045 to read as follows: Sec. 161.0045. INFORMATION ON IMMUNIZATION OF CHILDREN; 7 DUTIES OF HOSPITALS AND BIRTHING CENTERS. (a) Before a newborn 8 child is discharged after birth from a birthing center licensed 9 under Chapter 244 or a hospital, the birthing center or hospital 10 shall provide to the child's parent, managing conservator, or 11 12 guardian an informational pamphlet describing immunizations available to protect the child from disease. A physician or 13 14 certified nurse-midwife that attends the birth of a child outside of a birthing center or hospital shall provide the pamphlet to the 15 child's parent, managing conservator, or guardian as soon as 16 practicable following the birth of the child. An employee or 17 volunteer of the birthing center or hospital, the physician, the 18 certified nurse-midwife, or an employee or volunteer on behalf of 19 the physician or certified nurse-midwife shall personally deliver 20 21 the pamphlet to the child's parent, managing conservator, or 22 guardian. 23 (b) The department shall develop the informational pamphlet

24 required by this section.

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1	(c) The informational pamphlet must describe:
2	(1) the diseases for which the child may be immunized;
3	(2) the appropriate schedule for administration of the
4	immunizations to the child;
5	(3) the reasons the immunizations would be beneficial
6	for the child;
7	(4) the potential risks of the immunizations;
8	(5) any other information a parent, managing
9	conservator, or guardian needs to make an informed consent to the
10	immunizations; and
11	(6) the immunization registry.
12	(d) The department shall make the informational pamphlet
13	available to hospitals having a maternity unit, birthing centers,
14	physicians, and certified nurse-midwives.
15	(e) The Office of Early Childhood Coordination of the Health
16	and Human Services Commission shall coordinate funding for the
17	development, publication, and distribution of the informational
18	pamphlet. The development, publication, and distribution of the
19	pamphlet may be funded through means other than appropriations,
20	which may include gifts and grants and sale of sponsorship or
21	advertising.
22	SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 241, Health and Safety
23	Code, is amended by adding Section 241.029 to read as follows:
24	Sec. 241.029. INFORMATION ON IMMUNIZATION OF CHILDREN; DUTY
25	OF HOSPITAL. A hospital shall comply with Section 161.0045.
26	SECTION 3. Chapter 244, Health and Safety Code, is amended
27	by adding Section 244.0104 to read as follows:

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<u>Sec. 244.0104. INFORMATION ON IMMUNIZATION OF CHILDREN;</u>
<u>DUTY OF BIRTHING CENTER. A birthing center shall comply with</u>
<u>Section 161.0045.</u>

4 SECTION 4. Section 531.285, Government Code, is amended by 5 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

6 <u>(d) The office shall coordinate funding for the</u> 7 <u>development, publication, and distribution of the informational</u> 8 <u>pamphlet relating to immunization of children as required by</u> 9 <u>Section 161.0045, Health and Safety Code.</u>

10 SECTION 5. Not later than January 1, 2004, the Texas 11 Department of Health shall make available the informational 12 pamphlet described by Section 161.0045, Health and Safety Code, as 13 added by this Act. In developing the informational pamphlet, the 14 department may consider material contained in informational 15 pamphlets previously prepared by the department and may use 16 information previously compiled and available to the department.

SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.

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
