## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to vehicle fleet management services provided by the Texas
- 3 Building and Procurement Commission.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 2171.101(a), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The office of vehicle fleet management shall establish a
- 8 vehicle reporting system to assist each state agency in the
- 9 management of its vehicle fleet. A state agency shall be required
- 10 to submit the reports  $\underline{\text{on a monthly basis}}$  [ $\underline{\text{not more often than}}$
- 11 semiannually].
- SECTION 2. Sections 2171.102(a) and (b), Government Code,
- 13 are amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) The office of vehicle fleet management may, for a fee,
- 15 [shall] provide routine periodic maintenance service to state
- 16 agencies located in Travis County. [The office shall charge a fee
- 17 for the service.
- 18 (b) The office  $\underline{\text{may}}$  [shall] negotiate contracts for major
- 19 overhauls and other extensive mechanical work.
- SECTION 3. Sections 2171.104(c) and (d), Government Code,
- 21 are amended to read as follows:
- 22 (c) The management plan must address:
- 23 (1) opportunities for consolidating and privatizing
- the operation and management of vehicle fleets in areas where there

- is a concentration of state agencies, including the Capitol Complex
- 2 and the Health and Human Services Complex in Austin;
- 3 (2) the number and type of vehicles owned by each
- 4 agency and the purpose each vehicle serves;
- 5 (3) procedures to increase vehicle use and improve the
- 6 efficiency of the state vehicle fleet;
- 7 (4) procedures to reduce the cost of maintaining state
- 8 vehicles;
- 9 (5) procedures to handle surplus or salvage [the sale
- 10 of excess] state vehicles; and
- 11 (6) lower-cost alternatives to using state-owned
- 12 vehicles, including:
- 13 (A) using rental cars; and
- 14 (B) reimbursing employees for using personal
- 15 vehicles.
- 16 (d) The commission shall <u>require a state agency to transfer</u>
- 17 surplus or salvage vehicles identified by the management plan to
- 18 the commission and shall sell or dispose of the [excess] vehicles in
- 19 accordance with the provisions of Chapter 2175 that provide for
- 20 disposition of surplus or salvage property by the commission
- 21 [identified by the management plan and deposit the proceeds from
- 22 the sale into the account that the agency used to purchase the
- 23 vehicles].
- 24 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
