A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the voluntary regulation of persons providing certain
- 3 ophthalmic goods and services.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 352.002, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 352.002 DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 8 (1) "Board" means the Texas Board of Health.
- 9 (2) "Contact lens dispensing" means fabricating,
- 10 ordering, mechanically adjusting, dispensing, selling, and
- 11 delivering to a consumer contact lenses in accordance with a
- 12 prescription from a physician, optometrist, or therapeutic
- 13 optometrist, along with appropriate instructions for the care and
- 14 handling of the lenses. The term does not include, unless directed
- or approved by a physician:
- 16 (A) taking any measurements of the eye or the
- 17 cornea; or
- 18 (B) evaluating the physical fit of contact
- 19 lenses.
- 20 (3) "Contact lens prescription" means a written
- 21 specification from a physician, optometrist, or therapeutic
- 22 optometrist for therapeutic, corrective, or cosmetic contact
- 23 lenses that states the refractive power of the product and other
- 24 information required to be in the specification by the physician,

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- optometrist, therapeutic optometrist, Texas State Board of Medical
- 2 Examiners, or Texas Optometry Board.
- 3 (4) "Department" means the Texas Department of Health.
- 4 (5) "Dispensing optician" or "ophthalmic dispenser"
- 5 means a person who is not a registered optician, registered contact
- 6 lens technician, physician, optometrist, therapeutic optometrist,
- 7 or pharmacist, who provides or offers to provide spectacle or
- 8 contact lens dispensing services or products to the public.
- 9 (6) "Spectacle dispensing" means designing,
- 10 verifying, fitting, adjusting, selling, or delivering to a consumer
- 11 fabricated and finished ophthalmic devices, including spectacle
- 12 lenses and frames but excluding contact lenses, in accordance with
- 13 a prescription from a physician, therapeutic optometrist, or
- 14 optometrist. The term includes:
- 15 (A) prescription analysis and interpretation;
- 16 (B) the measurement of the face, including
- 17 interpupillary distances, to determine the size, shape, and
- 18 specifications of the spectacle lenses or frames best suited to the
- 19 wearer's needs;
- (c) the preparation and delivery of a work order
- 21 to a laboratory technician engaged in grinding lenses and
- 22 fabricating spectacles;
- 23 (D) the verification of the quality of finished
- 24 spectacle lenses;
- 25 (E) the adjustment of spectacle lenses or frames
- to the wearer's face; and
- 27 (F) the adjustment, repair, replacement, or

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- 1 reproduction of a previously prepared, specially fabricated
- 2 ophthalmic device.
- 3 (7) "Spectacle prescription" means a written
- 4 specification by a physician, therapeutic optometrist, or
- 5 optometrist for therapeutic or corrective lenses that states the
- 6 refractive power of the lenses and other information included in
- 7 the specification by the physician, therapeutic optometrist, or
- 8 optometrist.
- 9 (8) "Registered contact lens technician" means a
- 10 person registered under this act as a contact lens technician who
- 11 performs contact lens dispensing.
- 12 <u>(9) "Registered optician" means a person registered</u>
- 13 under this Act as a registered optician performs spectacle
- 14 dispensing.
- SECTION 2. 352.101, Occupations Code, is amended to read as
- 16 follows:
- 17 Section 352.101. REPRESENTATION TO PUBLIC. (a) A person
- 18 may not represent to the public that the person is a "Registered
- 19 Optician" ["Registered Dispensing Optician" or "Registered
- 20 Spectacle Dispenser"] unless the person is registered as an
- 21 [spectacle dispensing] optician and complies with this chapter.
- (b) A person may not represent to the public that the person
- 23 is a ["Registered Contact Lens Dispenser" or] "Registered Contact
- 24 Lens Technician" unless the person is registered as a contact lens
- 25 technicians [dispenser] and complies with this chapter.
- 26 (c) A person may not use abbreviations or other letters to
- 27 represent that the person is registered.

- 1 (d) A person properly registered under this chapter may
- 2 represent to the public that the person is a "Registered Dispensing
- 3 Optician[____]" ["Registered Spectacle Dispenser___"] or a "Registered
- 4 Contact Lens Technician[$_{\tau}$]." or $\frac{\text{"Registered Contact Lens}}{\text{"Registered Contact Lens}}$
- 5 Dispenser."
- 6 (e) A person registered under this Chapter as a contact lens
- 7 technician shall not be required to obtain a contact lens
- 8 dispensing permit under Chapter 353.
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 352.102. Occupations Code, is amended
- 10 to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 352.102. ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATE; QUALIFICATIONS. (a)
- 12 The department shall issue a certificate of registration to an
- 13 applicant who:
- 14 (1) applies and pays a registration fee;
- 15 (2) presents evidence satisfactory to the department
- 16 that the applicant has successfully completed the number of
- 17 classroom hours of training required by the board; and
- 18 (3) passes the appropriate examination required under
- 19 Section 352.103.
- 20 (b) The board may not require more than 30 classroom hours
- 21 of training as a prerequisite to registration.
- (c) A person may qualify and be registered as an optician
- 23 [spectacle dispenser], contact lens technician [dispenser], or
- 24 both.
- 25 SECTION 4. Section 352.201. Occupations Code, is amended
- 26 to read as follows:
- 27 352.201. DIRECTIONS FOR REGISTERED [DISPENSING] OR

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- 1 REGISTERED CONTACT LENS TECHNICIAN. A physician's directions,
- 2 instructions, or orders may be performed or a physician's
- 3 prescription may be filled by a registered [dispensing] optician or
- 4 <u>registered contact lens technician</u> who is separate from and
- 5 independent of the physician's office only if the directions,
- 6 instructions, orders, or prescription is:
- 7 (1) in writing; except that a physician's directions,
- 8 <u>instructions</u>, or orders may be communicated by telephone provided
- 9 that the registered optician or registered contact lens technician
- 10 sends a written acknowledgment of the physician's directions,
- instructions, or orders within 10 business days.
- 12 (2) of a scope and content and communicated to the
- 13 dispensing optician in a form and manner that, in the physician's
- 14 professional judgment, best serves the health, safety, and welfare
- of the physician's patient; and
- 16 (3) in a form and detail consistent with the
- 17 particular dispensing optician's skill and knowledge.
- 18 SECTION 5. Section 352.203, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- Sec. 352.203. DELEGATION BY PHYSICIAN. A registered
- 21 contact lens <u>technician</u> [<u>dispenser</u>] may take measurements of the
- 22 eye or cornea and evaluate the physical fit of lenses for a patient
- 23 of a physician if the physician has delegated in writing to the
- 24 technician [dispenser] those responsibilities for that specific
- 25 patient in accordance with Sections 351.005 and 352.201.
- SECTION 6. Section 351.005 (a) (5), Occupations Code,
- 27 (Texas Optometry Act), is amended to read as follows:

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- 1 Sec. 351.005 (a) (5). APPLICATION OF CHAPTER; EXEMPTIONS.
- 2 (5) prevent or interfere with the right of an optician
- 3 <u>or a contact lens technician</u> [dispensing optician] registered under
- 4 Chapter 352 to engage in spectacle or contact lens dispensing under
- 5 that chapter;
- 6 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
