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| 2 | relating to the Texas Water Advisory Council. |
| 3 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 4 | SECTION 1. Sections 9.002 through 9.009, 9.016, and 9.017, |
| 5 | Water Code, are amended to read as follows: |
| 6 | Sec. 9.002. CREATION AND MEMBERSHIP. (a) The council <u>is</u> |
| 7 | created to provide the governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of |
| 8 | the house of representatives, and legislature with the resource of |
| 9 | a select council of expertise on state water issues and consists of |
| 10 | 15 [13] members as follows: |
| 11 | (1) the chairman, or a board member designated by the |
| 12 | chairman, of the Texas Water Development Board; |
| 13 | (2) the chairman, or a commissioner designated by the |
| 14 | chairman, of the commission; |
| 15 | (3) the chairman, or a commissioner designated by the |
| 16 | chairman, of the Parks and Wildlife Commission; |
| 17 | (4) the commissioner of agriculture; |
| 18 | (5) the commissioner of the General Land Office; |
| 19 | (6) three members of the house of representatives |
| 20 | appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; |
| 21 | (7) <u>three</u> [two] members of the senate appointed by the |
| 22 | lieutenant governor; and |
| 23 | (8) <u>four</u> [three] members of the general public |
| 24 | appointed by the governor, one representing groundwater |

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1 management, one representing surface water management, [and] one 2 representing the environmental community, and one representing the 3 coastal region.

4 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), council [Council]
5 members may not delegate participation or council duties to staff.

6 (c) A council member who is a member of the governing body of 7 <u>a state agency may delegate participation and council duties to the</u> 8 <u>agency's executive administrator, executive director, or deputy</u> 9 commissioner, as appropriate.

10 Sec. 9.003. TERMS. (a) <u>Public members serve staggered</u> 11 <u>three-year terms</u> [Except for the commissioner of the General Land 12 Office and the commissioner of agriculture, council members who are 13 officials of state agencies serve terms as determined by the 14 chairman of each agency].

15 (b) <u>Public</u> [Council members who are members of the general 16 <u>public serve staggered six-year terms with the term of one member</u> 17 <u>expiring August 31 of each odd-numbered year.</u>

18 [(c) Council] members may be reappointed to serve 19 additional terms.

20 (c) Legislative members serve at the discretion of the 21 <u>original appointing authority.</u>

(d) A vacancy on the council shall be filled by appointmentby the original appointing authority for the unexpired term.

Sec. 9.004. OFFICERS OF THE COUNCIL. (a) <u>The council shall</u> elect a chair from among the legislative members of the council. The [governor shall appoint a council member as the] chair of the council shall serve [for] a two-year term [expiring May 31 of each

1 even=numbered year].

The council shall alternate the selection of the chair 2 (b) every two years between a house and senate council member [have a 3 4 secretary of the council who serves at the pleasure of the council 5 and is accountable only to the council].

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Sec. 9.005. COUNCIL STAFF. On request by the council, the senate and house standing committees with primary responsibility 7 over water resource management, the commission, the Parks and 8 9 Wildlife Department, the Department of Agriculture, and the Texas Water Development Board shall provide any staff [other than the 10 secretary of the council necessary to assist the council in the 11 performance of its duties. 12

Sec. 9.006. MEETINGS. (a) The council shall <u>conduct public</u> 13 14 meetings at the discretion of the chair at least twice a year [meet 15 at least once in each calendar quarter]. Eight [Six] members 16 constitute a quorum.

17 (b) The council is subject to Chapters 551 and 2001, Government Code. 18

Sec. 9.007. COMPENSATION OF MEMBERS. (a) Members of the 19 council serve without compensation but public members may be 20 reimbursed by legislative appropriation for actual and necessary 21 expenses related to the performance of council duties. 22

(b) Reimbursement under Subsection (a) is subject to the 23 24 approval of the council [chair].

Sec. 9.008. POWERS AND DUTIES OF COUNCIL. 25 (a) The 26 governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives may issue charges to the council on state water 27

| 1 | issues. The council shall provide recommendations to the governor, |
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| 2 | lieutenant governor, or speaker of the house of representatives, as |
| 3 | appropriate, based on the charges [The council shall: |
| 4 | [(1) heighten the level of dialogue on significant |
| 5 | water policy issues and, in an advisory role only, strive to provide |
| 6 | focus and recommendations on state water policy initiatives, |
| 7 | including: |
| 8 | [(A) promoting flexibility and incentives for |
| 9 | water desalination, brush control, regionalization, weather |
| 10 | modification projects, and public-private partnerships relating to |
| 11 | water projects; |
| 12 | [(B) promoting adequate financing for surface |

| 10 | (b) If the governor, lieutenant governor, or speaker of the |
| 11 | house of representatives does not issue charges to the council, the |

| 13 | to the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of |
| 14 | representatives. The governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of |
| 15 | the house of representatives may select a total of not more than |

| 26 | Sec. 9.009. REPORT. (a) The council shall submit a report |
| 27 | on its recommendations [Not later than December 1 of each |
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1 even-numbered year, the council shall submit a report] to the 2 governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of 3 representatives and to the senate and house standing committees 4 with primary responsibility over water resource management <u>not</u> 5 later than December 31 each year [and financing].

6 (b) The report must include <u>recommendations</u> [findings of] 7 the council made <u>on charges issued by or issues selected from the</u> 8 <u>council's list by the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of</u> 9 <u>the house of representatives during the year</u> [in the periodic 10 reviews of authorities during the preceding two-year period and any 11 other findings and recommendations the council considers 12 necessary].

13 (c) The governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the 14 house of representatives may request additional reports on specific 15 charges at any time.

16 (d) The council may request reports from committees
17 established under Sections 9.008(f) and (g).

Sec. 9.016. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION. The council shall encourage public <u>participation at council meetings and public</u> input regarding the <u>council's purpose</u>, the exercise of its powers and duties under Section 9.008, <u>and</u> its preparation of the report described in Section 9.009[, and its analysis of authorities under <u>Sections 9.010 and 9.011</u>].

Sec. 9.017. DISSOLUTION OF COUNCIL AND ACCOUNT. Unless extended by the <u>79th</u> [78th] Texas Legislature, this chapter and the interagency water advisory account expire on <u>December 31</u> [September 1], 2005.

C.S.H.B. No. 3082 1 SECTION 2. Sections 9.010, 9.011, and 9.012, Water Code, 2 are repealed.

3 SECTION 3. (a) The terms of public members serving on the 4 Texas Water Advisory Council on the effective date of this Act 5 expire on that date.

(b) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this 6 Act, the governor shall appoint four members of the general public 7 8 to the Texas Water Advisory Council as provided by Section 9.002, Water Code, as amended by this Act. The governor may reappoint a 9 person who was serving on the council on the effective date of this 10 Act. The newly appointed public members shall draw lots to 11 determine which two members serve two-year terms and which two 12 members serve three-year terms. 13

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
