A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

<u>L</u>	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the enrollment and absence of students in what
- 3 constitutes a school year in public primary and secondary schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 25.081(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (b) The commissioner may approve the instruction of
- 8 students for fewer than the number of days required under
- 9 Subsection (a) if disaster, flood, extreme weather conditions, fuel
- 10 curtailment, absence because of illness affecting at least 10
- 11 percent of the instructional faculty or students, or another
- 12 calamity causes the closing of schools.
- SECTION 2. Sections 25.0811(b) and (c), Education Code, are
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 (b) If a school district intends to apply under Section
- 7.056 for a waiver of the prohibition prescribed by Subsection (a),
- 17 the district must:
- 18 (1) at least 60 days before the date the district
- 19 submits the application for the waiver, publish notice
- 20 <u>electronically on the Internet</u> [in a newspaper having general
- 21 <u>circulation in the district</u>]:
- 22 (A) stating that the district intends to apply
- for a waiver of the prohibition concerning the date of the first day
- of instruction for students; and

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- 1 (B) specifying the date on which the district
- 2 intends to begin instruction for students; and
- 3 (2) hold a public hearing concerning the date of the
- 4 first day of instruction for students.
- 5 (c) The application for a waiver of the prohibition
- 6 prescribed by Subsection (a) must include a summary of the opinions
- 7 expressed at the public hearing held under Subsection (b)(2)[τ
- 8 including any consensus of opinion expressed conerning the date of
- 9 the first day of instruction for students].
- SECTION 3. Section 25.087(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 (b) A school district shall excuse a student from attending
- 13 school for the purpose of observing religious holy days, including
- 14 traveling for that purpose. A school district shall excuse a
- 15 student for temporary absence resulting from health care
- 16 professionals' attendance to the student's health care needs
- 17 [professionals] if that student commences classes or returns to
- 18 school on the same day of the appointment. A student whose absence
- 19 is excused under this subsection may not be penalized for that
- 20 absence and shall be counted as if the student attended school for
- 21 purposes of calculating the average daily attendance of students in
- 22 the school district. A student whose absence is excused under this
- 23 subsection shall be allowed a reasonable time to make up school work
- 24 missed on those days. If the student satisfactorily completes the
- 25 school work, the day of absence shall be counted as a day of
- 26 compulsory attendance.
- 27 SECTION 4. Section 25.001 (b), Education Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 (b) The board of trustees of a school district or its
- 3 designee shall admit into the public schools of the district free of
- 4 tuition a person who is over five and younger than 21 years of age on
- 5 the first day the school year begins in the year [of September of
- 6 the school year] in which admission is sought if:
- 7 (1) the person and either parent of the person reside
- 8 in the school district;
- 9 (2) the person does not reside in the school district
- 10 but a parent of the person resides in the school district and that
- 11 parent is a joint managing conservator or the sole managing
- 12 conservator or possessory conservator of the person;
- 13 (3) the person and the person's guardian or other
- 14 person having lawful control of the person under a court order
- 15 reside within the school district;
- 16 (4 the person has established a separate residence
- 17 under Subsection (d);
- 18 (5) the person is homeless, as defined by 42 U.S.C.
- 19 Section 11302, regardless of the residence of the person, of either
- 20 parent of the person, or of the person's guardian or other person
- 21 having lawful control of the person;
- 22 (6) the person is a foreign exchange student placed
- 23 with a host family that resides in the school district by a
- 24 nationally recognized foreign exchange program, unless the school
- 25 district has applied for and been granted a waiver by the
- 26 commissioner under Subsection (e);
- 27 (7) the person resides at a residential facility

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- located in the district; or
- 2 (8) the person resides in the school district and is 18
- 3 years of age or older or the person's disabilities of minority have
- 4 been removed.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act applies beginning with the 2004-2005
- 6 school year.
- 7 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
