5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 7, Transportation Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 504 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 504. SPECIALTY LICENSE PLATES
9	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
10	Sec. 504.001. DEFINITIONS. (a) In this chapter,
11	"commission" and "director" have the meanings assigned by Section
12	201.001.
13	(b) A word or phrase that is not defined by this chapter but
14	is defined by Section 502.001 has the meaning in this chapter that
15	is assigned by that section.
16	Sec. 504.002. PROVISIONS OF GENERAL APPLICABILITY. Unless
17	expressly provided by this chapter or by department rule:
18	(1) any vehicle is eligible to be issued specialty
19	license plates, provided that the department may vary the design of
20	a plate to accommodate or reflect its use on a motor vehicle other
21	than a passenger car or light truck;
22	(2) an application for specialty license plates must
23	be submitted in the manner specified by the department, provided
24	that if issuance of a specialty license plate is limited to

particular persons or motor vehicles, the application must be 1 2 accompanied by evidence satisfactory to the department that the 3 applicant or the applicant's vehicle is eligible; 4 (3) the fee for issuance of a speciality license plate is in addition to each other fee that is paid for or at the time of 5 6 the registration of the motor vehicle and shall be deposited to the 7 credit of the state highway fund; 8 (4) each fee described by this chapter is an annual 9 fee, provided that the department may prorate the fee for a specialty license plate fee on a monthly basis to align the license 10 plate fee to the registration period for the motor vehicle for which 11 the license plate was issued, and if a fee is prorated, the 12 allocation of the fee by this chapter to an account or fund shall be 13 14 prorated in proportion; 15 (5) the department is the exclusive owner of the design of each specialty license plate; 16 17 (6) the director may refuse to issue a specialty license plate with a design or alphanumeric pattern that the 18 director considers potentially objectionable to one or more 19 members of the public and the director's refusal may not be 20 21 overturned in the absence of an abuse of discretion; 22 (7) for each specialty license plate that is issued through a county tax assessor-collector and for which the 23 24 department is allocated a portion of a fee for administrative 25 costs, the department shall credit 50 cents from its administrative 26 costs to the county treasurer of the applicable county, who shall credit the money to the general fund of the county to defray the 27

2	(8) if a speciality license plate is lost, stolen, or
3	mutilated, an application for a replacement plate must be
4	accompanied by the fee prescribed by Section 502.184(a)(2);
5	(9) if the owner of a motor vehicle for which a

7	reason ceases to be eligible for that specialty license plate, the
8	owner shall return the specialty license plate to the department;

10	(10) a person who is issued a specialty license plate
11	may not transfer it to another person or vehicle without first
12	receiving approval from the department.
13	Sec. 504.003. SOUVENIR LICENSE PLATES. (a) The department
14	may issue a souvenir version of any specialty license plate.
15	(b) The fee for a single souvenir license plate is \$10. If
16	the souvenir license plate is personalized, the fee for the plate is

18	(c) A souvenir license plate may not be used on a motor
19	vehicle and is not an insignia of registration for a motor vehicle.
20	Each souvenir license plate must be identified by the department in
21	a way that identifies it to law enforcement officers and others as a
22	souvenir license plate.

12	(c) The fee for issuance of a personalized license plate is

14	(d) The department may not issue a replacement set of
15	personalized license plates to the same person before the sixth
16	anniversary of the date of issuance unless the applicant for

18	(e) Of each fee collected by the department under this
19	section:
20	(1) \$1.25 shall be used to defray the cost of
21	administering this section; and
22	(2) the remainder shall be deposited to the credit of
23	the general revenue fund.
24	Sec. 504.102. PERSONALIZATION OF OTHER SPECIALTY LICENSE
25	PLATES. Unless expressly prohibited by this chapter or department
26	rule, any specialty license plate issued under this chapter may be
27	personalized. If another specialty license plate is personalized,

1	the fee established by Section 504.101(c) shall be added to the fee
2	for issuance of that specialty license plate.
3	Sec. 504.103. DESIGN AND ALPHANUMERIC PATTERN. The
4	department has sole control over the design, typeface, color, and
5	alphanumeric pattern for a personalized license plate.

7	SUBCHAPTER C. LICENSE PLATES FOR VEHICLES USED BY PERSONS WITH
8	DISABILITIES
9	Sec. 504.201. PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES. (a) In this
10	section:
11	(1) "Disability" and "mobility problem that
12	substantially impairs a person's ability to ambulate" have the
13	meanings assigned by Section 681.001.
14	(2) "Legally blind" means a condition described by
15	Section 681.001(2)(B) or (C).
16	(b) The department shall issue specialty license plates for
17	a motor vehicle that:
18	(1) has a manufacturer's rated carrying capacity of
19	two tons or less; and
20	(2) is regularly operated for noncommercial use by or
21	for the transportation of a person with a permanent disability.
22	(c) An owner of a motor vehicle regularly operated by or for
23	the transportation of a person described by Subsection (a) may
24	apply to the department for registration under this section.
25	(d) The initial application for specialty license plates
26	under this section must be accompanied by a written statement from a
27	physician who is licensed to practice medicine in this state or in a

C.S.H.B. No. 3106 state adjacent to this state or who is authorized by applicable law 1 2 to practice medicine in a hospital or other health facility of the Department of Veterans Affairs. If the applicant has a mobility 3 4 problem caused by a disorder of the foot, the written statement may 5 be issued by a person licensed to practice podiatry in this state or 6 a state adjacent to this state. In this subsection, "podiatry" has the meaning assigned by Section 681.001. The statement must 7 8 certify that the person making the application or on whose behalf 9 the application is made is legally blind or has a mobility problem that substantially impairs the person's ability to ambulate. The 10 statement must also certify whether a mobility problem is temporary 11 12 or permanent. A written statement is not required as acceptable medical proof if: 13 14 (1) the person with a disability: 15 (A) has had a limb, hand, or foot amputated; or 16 (B) must use a wheelchair; and 17 (2) the applicant and the county assessor-collector processing the application execute an affidavit attesting to the 18 19 person's disability. (e) A person with a disability may receive: 20 21 (1) one disabled parking placard under Section 681.002 22 if the person receives a set of license plates under this section; 23 or 24 (2) two disabled parking placards under Section 25 681.002 if the person does not receive a set of license plates under 26 this section. 27 (f) A license plate issued under this section must include

1	the symbol of access adopted by Rehabilitation International in

15	entitled to specialty license plates under this section may
16	register, for the person's own use, one eligible motor vehicle
17	without payment of any fee other than the registration fee for the
18	vehicle. Registration under this section is valid for one year.
19	(b) The department shall issue a specialty license plate for
20	a motor vehicle that has a manufacturer's rated carrying capacity
21	of two tons or less and that is owned by a veteran of the United
22	States armed forces. A veteran is entitled to register, for the
23	person's own use, two motor vehicles under this section if the

5	(c) An organization may register a motor vehicle under this
6	section if:

8	veterans of the United States armed forces who have suffered, as a
9	result of military service, a service-connected disability; and
10	(2) the veterans are not charged for the
11	transportation.
12	(d) A statement by the veterans county service officer of
13	the county in which a vehicle described by Subsection (b) is
14	registered or by the Department of Veterans Affairs that a vehicle
15	is used exclusively to transport veterans with disabilities without
16	charge is satisfactory proof of eligibility for an organization.
17	(e) License plates issued under this section must include:
18	(1) the letters "DV" as a prefix or suffix to any
19	numeral on the plate; and
20	(2) the words "Disabled Vet."
21	(f) The initial and renewal fee for the first set of license
22	plates is \$3. An applicant may be issued additional license plates
23	without payment of an additional fee. If a license plate is lost,
24	stolen, or mutilated, on payment of a \$1 fee, the department shall
25	issue a set of replacement plates.

No. 3106 plates under this subchapter for a van or bus operated by an 1 2 institution, facility, or residential retirement community for the elderly or for veterans in which an eligible person resides, 3 4 including: (1) an institution that holds a license issued under 5 6 Chapter 242, Health and Safety Code; or 7 (2) a facility that holds a license issued under 8 Chapter 246 or 247 of that code. 9 (b) An application for license plates under this section must be accompanied by a written statement signed by the 10 administrator or manager of the institution, facility, or 11 12 retirement community certifying that the institution, facility, or retirement community regularly transports, as a part of the 13 services that the institution, facility, or retirement community 14 15 provides, one or more eligible persons who reside in the 16 institution, facility, or retirement community. Unless expressly provided by this 25 26 subchapter or department rule: 27 (1) the department shall design specialty license

2	(2) a person is not eligible to be issued a specialty
3	license plate under this subchapter if the person was discharged

6	Sec. 504.302. SURVIVING SPOUSES OF CERTAIN MILITARY
7	VETERANS. (a) The surviving spouse of a person who would be
8	eligible for a specialty license plate under this subchapter is
9	entitled to continue to register one vehicle under the applicable
10	section as long as the spouse remains unmarried.
11	(b) An applicant for registration under this section must
12	submit proof of the eligibility of the applicant's deceased spouse
13	for the applicable specialty license plate.
14	(c) A surviving spouse applying for specialty license
15	plates under this section must submit a written statement that the
16	spouse is unmarried. If the surviving spouse is applying for Former
17	Prisoner of War, Pearl Harbor Survivor, or Purple Heart specialty
18	license plates, the statement must be sworn to by the surviving
19	spouse.
20	Sec. 504.303. MEMBERS OR FORMER MEMBERS OF UNITED STATES
21	ARMED FORCES. (a) The department shall issue specialty license
22	plates for active or former members of the United States armed
23	forces. The license plates must designate the appropriate branch
24	of the United States armed forces.
25	(b) The fee for issuance of the license plates is:
26	(1) \$10 for the first set of license plates; and
27	(2) \$15 for each additional set of license plates.

7	(3) the Marine Corps League or its auxiliary.

At the request of the 20 21 sponsor, distribution of the license plate may be limited by the 22 department.

23 (d) The fee for issuance of license plates authorized under 24 this subchapter is \$30.

(e) The first \$15,000 collected as fees for a new specialty
 license plate shall be used to reimburse the department for its
 initial costs in beginning production of the new specialty license

MANUFACTURED HOUSING. Manufactured housing, as defined by Section 1201.003, Occupations Code, is not a 16 17 vehicle subject to this chapter. Sec. 502.0073. POWER SWEEPERS. (a) An owner of a power 18 sweeper is not required to register the power sweeper. 19 (b) In this section, "power sweeper" means an implement, 20 21 with or without motive power, designed for the removal by broom, vacuum, or regenerative air system of debris, dirt, gravel, litter, 22 or sand from asphaltic concrete or cement concrete surfaces, 23 24 including surfaces of parking lots, roads, streets, highways, and warehouse floors. The term includes a vehicle on which the 25 26 implement is permanently mounted if the vehicle is used only as a 27 power sweeper.

10	owner or the owner's agent or employee across the highway is not a

12	Sec. 502.0079. VEHICLES OPERATED BY CERTAIN NONRESIDENTS.
13	(a) A nonresident owner of a motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer
14	that is registered in the state or country in which the person
15	resides may operate the vehicle to transport persons or property
16	for compensation without being registered in this state, if the
17	person does not exceed two trips in a calendar month and each trip

No. 3106 state or country other than this state whose presence in this state 1 2 is as a visitor and who does not engage in gainful employment or enter into business or an occupation, except as may otherwise be 3 4 provided by any reciprocal agreement with another state or country. 5 (d) This section does not prevent: 6 (1) a nonresident owner of a motor vehicle from 7 operating the vehicle in this state for the sole purpose of 8 marketing farm products raised exclusively by the person; or (2) a resident of an adjoining state or country from 9 operating in this state a privately owned and registered vehicle to 10 go to and from the person's place of regular employment and to make 11 trips to purchase merchandise, if the vehicle is not operated for 12 13 compensation. 14 (e) The privileges provided by this section may be allowed 15 only if, under the laws of the appropriate state or country, similar privileges are granted to vehicles registered under the laws of 16 17 this state and owned by residents of this state. (f) This section does not affect the right or status of a 18 19 vehicle owner under any reciprocal agreement between this state and another state or country. 20 SECTION 3. PARADE VEHICLES OWNED BY NONPROFIT SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS. (a) A motor vehicle owned and operated by a 25 26 nonprofit service organization and designed, constructed, and used 27 primarily for parade purposes is subject to registration as

provided by this chapter but is exempt from the fee otherwise
prescribed by this chapter.
(b) Subsection (a) does not apply to a vehicle for which a
registration fee has been paid under other law.
Sec. 502.188. CERTAIN SOIL CONSERVATION EQUIPMENT. (a) The
owner of a truck-tractor, semitrailer, or low-boy trailer used on a
highway exclusively to transport the owner's soil conservation
machinery or equipment used in clearing real property, terracing,
or building farm ponds, levees, or ditches may register the vehicle
for a fee equal to 50 percent of the fee otherwise prescribed by
this chapter for the vehicle.

one semitrailer or low-boy trailer under this section.
(c) An owner applying for registration under this section

issued under that section, which shall be governed under Section
504.801, Transportation Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 5. (a) This section shall be implemented only if 6 the Legislative Budget Board determines that this Act would 7 8 otherwise reduce the amount of money allocated to the general 9 revenue fund from the issuance by the Texas Department of Transportation of specialty license plates during fiscal years 2004 10 and 2005 relative to the amount of money allocated to the general 11 revenue fund from the issuance by that department of specialized 12 license plates during fiscal years 2002 and 2003. 13

14 (b) The Texas Department of Transportation shall reduce the 15 amount of fees allocated to the department's administrative costs and allocate that amount to general revenue for deposit to the 16 17 credit of the accounts specified in each section of Chapter 504, Transportation Code, as added by this Act. The amount of the 18 reduction and reallocation shall be the amount necessary to ensure 19 that sums allocated to the general revenue fund are not reduced as 20 specified in Subsection (a) of this section. 21 The reduction in administrative costs shall be taken proportionately from each 22 specialty plate so that each will be reduced by the same percentage 23 24 amount.

25 (c) This section expires September 1, 2005.

26 SECTION 6. (a) In considering an application for new 27 specialty license plates or the revision of an existing license

plate under Subchapter I, Chapter 504, Transportation Code, as added by this Act, the Texas Department of Transportation shall approve, adopt, or create any new license plate or proposed license plate that complies with Chapter 504, Transportation Code, as added by this Act, and that was described in a bill filed in the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003.

(b) This section expires December 31, 2004.

8 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
