H.B. No. 3121

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to making ephedrine and plant materials containing 3 ephedrine alkaloids Schedule V controlled substances. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. The Commissioner shall, under his authority 5 6 pursuant to Health and Safety Code Title 6, Chapter 481, the Texas Controlled Substances Act, section 481.032, Schedules, add to 7 Schedule V stimulants, ephedrine. Such addition shall include the 8 following requirements: 9 (2) Ephedrine, including plant materials that are 10 processed containing naturally occurring ephedrine alkaloids. 11 12 Excluded are the following formulations: 13 (a) Solid dosage forms that combine active 14 ingredients in the following ranges for each recommended dose: ephedrine, its salts, isomers or salts of isomers not to exceed 12.5 15 milligrams (mg) combined with at least 200 mg of guiafenesin; 16 ephedrine, its salts, isomers or salts of isomers not to exceed 25 17 18 mg combined with at least 400 mg guiafenesin; (b) Liquid oral dosage forms that combine active 19 ingredients in the following ranges for each 5 milliliter (ml) 20 21 dose: dextromethorphan HBr (not more than 10 mg), chlorpheniramine maleate (not more than 2 mg), ephedrine HCl (not more than 5 mg), 22 23 phenylephrine (not more than 5 mg), ammonium chloride (not more than 40 mg), ipecac fluidextract (not more than 0.005 ml); 24

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1	(c) Anorectal preparations containing less than
2	5.0% ephedrine;
3	(d) Nasal decongestant preparations containing
4	0.5% or less ephedrine; and
5	(e) Any ephedrine-containing drug product that
6	is marketed pursuant to an approved new drug application under the
7	Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.
8	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003. The
9	Commissioner shall adopt rules to implement this Act by January 31,
10	2004.
