9	commission shall <u>operate</u> [ <del>develop</del> ] a Blindness Education,

12	screening and treatment to prevent blindness for residents who are
13	not covered under an adequate health benefit plan; and
14	(2) transition services to blind disabled individuals

17	(b) [The commission shall implement the program only to the

20	(1) public education about blindness and other eye

If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
