Sections 305.028(a), (b), (c), and (f), 4 Government Code, are amended to read as follows: 5 6 (a) In this section: (1) "Client" means a person or entity for which the 7 registrant is registered or is required to be registered. 8

 10 registrant has been reimbursed, retained, or employed to

- 17 SECTION 3. Section 305.028, Government Code, as amended by
- 18 this Act, applies only to a conflict of interest that arises on or
- 19 after September 1, 2003. A conflict of interest that arises before
- 20 September 1, 2003, is covered by the law in effect when the conflict
- 21 arose, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 22 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
