A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 relating to notice of nutritional information by a chain

- 3 restaurant; providing a criminal penalty.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 6, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Chapter 442 to read as follows:

7 CHAPTER 442. NUTRITIONAL VALUE INFORMATION

- 8 Sec. 442.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "chain
- 9 restaurant" means an establishment operating at eight or more
- 10 locations in this state with the same name and under common
- 11 ownership that derives 75 percent or more of the establishment's
- 12 gross revenue from the sale of food and beverages, not including
- 13 <u>alcoholic beverages</u>, for on-premises consumption.
- Sec. 442.002. APPLICABILITY. This chapter does not apply
- 15 to a hotel or motel, except that this chapter applies to a chain
- 16 restaurant at a hotel or motel.
- Sec. 442.003. PAMPHLET OF NUTRITIONAL VALUE. (a) A chain
- 18 restaurant shall prepare a pamphlet containing a statement of
- 19 <u>nutritional value for each food item listed on a menu of the</u>
- 20 restaurant. The pamphlet may list the nutritional value for a
- 21 complete meal or may separately list each food item and any
- 22 associated food product, such as a topping.
- 23 (b) The pamphlet must:
- 24 (1) contain for each meal or food item:

1	(A) total calories;
2	(B) calories from fat;
3	(C) total fat grams;
4	(D) milligrams of cholesterol;
5	(E) milligrams of sodium;
6	(F) total grams of carbohydrates;
7	(G) total grams of dietary fiber;
8	(H) total grams of sugar; and
9	(I) total grams of protein;
10	(2) be available to each customer at each restaurant
11	<pre>location;</pre>
12	(3) be printed in a font size not more than one font
13	size smaller than the smallest font size used to list the food
14	<pre>items; and</pre>
15	(4) be laminated or published in another similar
16	durable form.
17	(c) The pamphlet of nutritional value must contain the
18	following statement at the bottom of each page of the pamphlet that
19	contains the nutritional value of a meal or food item for which
20	<pre>one-third or more of the total calories are attributable to fat:</pre>
21	"EATING FATTY FOODS MAY LEAD TO OBESITY."
22	(d) The statement required by Subsection (c) must be in a
23	conspicuous place and be printed in a font size at least one font
24	size larger than the statement of nutritional value.
25	(e) A chain restaurant shall have a number of pamphlets
26	equal to one-third of the number of seats available for customers at
27	the restaurant. Before taking a customer's order, a person

- 2 pamphlet.
- 3 (f) A chain restaurant that does not seat customers must
- 4 have at least one pamphlet available to customers on request.
- 5 (g) A chain restaurant offering drive-through service
- 6 shall:
- 7 (1) list on the drive-through menu board the calories
- 8 for each food item or meal; and
- 9 (2) print at the bottom of the menu board in a font
- 10 size at least one font size larger than the font size used to list
- 11 the food items: "PAMPHLET OF NUTRITIONAL VALUE AVAILABLE ON
- 12 <u>REQU</u>EST."
- Sec. 442.004. CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) The owner or operator
- of a chain restaurant commits an offense if the person violates
- 15 <u>Section 442.003.</u>
- 16 (b) An owner or operator of a chain restaurant commits an
- 17 offense if the person knowingly serves a food item for which a
- 18 pamphlet of nutritional value is not made available in accordance
- 19 with this chapter.
- 20 (c) An offense under this section is a misdemeanor
- 21 punishable by:
- 22 (1) a fine of not less than \$25 or more than \$100;
- 23 (2) confinement in jail for a term not to exceed 30
- 24 days; or
- 25 (3) both fine and confinement.
- 26 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
