## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the elimination of certain membership requirements for
- 3 local workforce development boards and of certain programs
- 4 administered by those boards.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 2308.256(b), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (b) Private sector representatives on the board are
- 9 selected from individuals nominated by general-purpose business
- 10 organizations that have consulted with and received
- 11 recommendations from other business organizations in the workforce
- 12 development area. [The number of the nominations may not be less
- 13 than 150 percent of the number of individuals to be appointed under
- 14 Subsection (a)(1). The nominations and the individuals selected
- 15 from the nominations must reasonably represent the industrial and
- 16 demographic composition of the business community. Not less than
- one-half of the business and industry representatives must be, if
- 18 possible, representatives of small businesses, including minority
- 19 businesses.
- 20 SECTION 2. The following laws are repealed:
- 21 (1) Section 2308.3036, Government Code;
- 22 (2) Section 2308.3037, Government Code; and
- 23 (3) Section 2308.3038, Government Code.
- SECTION 3. (a) The local workforce development board

- demonstration project program established under Section 2308.3036,
- 2 Government Code, is abolished on the effective date of this Act.
- 3 (b) All unobligated and unexpended balances in the local
- 4 workforce development board demonstration project fund account
- 5 created under Section 2308.3037, Government Code, as that section
- 6 existed immediately before repeal by this Act, are transferred on
- 7 the effective date of this Act to the general revenue fund.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
