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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to certain veterans' assistance programs. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 161.001(a)(7), Natural Resources Code, 4 5 is amended to read as follows: 6 (7) "Veteran" means a person who: (A)(i) served not less than 90 continuous days, 7 unless sooner discharged by reason of a service-connected 8 disability, on active duty in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast 9 Guard, United States Public Health Service (as constituted under 42 10 U.S.C. Section 201 et seq.), or Marine Corps of the United States 11 12 after September 16, 1940, and who on the date of filing an application under the program has not been dishonorably discharged 13 14 from the branch of the service in which the person served; (ii) has at least 20 years of active or 15 reserve military service as computed when determining the person's 16 eligibility to receive retired pay under applicable federal law; 17 [<del>or</del>] 18 (iii) has enlisted or received 19 an appointment in the Texas National Guard, who has completed all 20 21 initial active duty training required as a condition of the enlistment or appointment, and who on the date of filing the 22 person's application has not been dishonorably discharged from the 23 24 Texas National Guard; or

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1	(iv) served in the armed forces of the
2	Republic of Vietnam between February 28, 1961, and May 7, 1975, if
3	the board adopts a rule regarding these veterans under Subsection
4	<u>(b);</u>
5	(B) at the time of the person's enlistment,
6	induction, commissioning, appointment, or drafting was a bona fide
7	resident of this state or has resided in this state at least <u>one</u>
8	<u>year [five years</u> ] immediately before the date of filing an
9	application under this chapter; and
10	(C) at the time of the person's application under
11	this chapter is a bona fide resident of this state. The term
12	includes the unmarried surviving spouse of a veteran who died or who
13	is identified as missing in action if the deceased or missing
14	veteran meets the requirements of this section, with the exception
15	that the deceased or missing veteran need not have served 90
16	continuous days under Paragraph (A)(i) of this subdivision, and if
17	the deceased or missing veteran was a bona fide resident of this
18	state at the time of enlistment, induction, commissioning,
19	appointment, or drafting.
20	SECTION 2. Section 161.001(b), Natural Resources Code, is
21	amended to read as follows:
22	(b) Notwithstanding Subdivision (7) of Subsection (a) of
23	this section, the board may by rule change the definition of
24	"veteran" as necessary or appropriate to protect the best interests
25	of the program. <u>If the board adopts a rule to change the definition</u>
26	of "veteran" to include a person who served in the armed forces of
27	the Republic of Vietnam between February 28, 1961, and May 7, 1975,

## the rule must include procedures for establishing proof of that 1 2 service. SECTION 3. Section 162.001(a)(8), Natural Resources Code, 3 4 is amended to read as follows: 5 (8) "Veteran" has the meaning assigned by Section 6 161.001 [means a person who: $[(\Lambda)(i)]$ served not less than 90 continuous days, 7 8 unless sooner discharged by reason of a service-connected 9 disability, on active duty in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, United States Public Health Service (as constituted under 42 10 U.S.C. Section 201 et seq.), or Marine Corps of the United States 11 after September 16, 1940, and who on the date of filing a loan 12 application has not been dishonorably discharged from the branch of 13 the service in which the person served; 14 15 [(ii) has at least 20 years of active or reserve military service as computed when determining the person's 16 eligibility to receive retired pay under applicable federal law; or 17 [(iii) has enlisted or received an 18 appointment in the Texas National Guard, who has completed all 19 initial active duty training required as a condition of the 20 enlistment or appointment, and who on the date of filing the 21 person's loan application has not been dishonorably discharged from 22 the Texas National Guard; 23 [(B) at the time of the person's enlistment, 24 25 induction, commissioning, appointment, or drafting was a bona fide resident of this state or has resided in this state at least five 26

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years immediately before the date of filing an application for a

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1 loan; and [(C) at the time of the person's application for 2 a loan under this chapter is a bona fide resident of this state. The 3 term includes the unmarried surviving spouse of a veteran who died 4 5 or who is identified as missing in action if the deceased or missing 6 veteran meets the requirements in this section, with the exception that the deceased or missing veteran need not have served 90 7 continuous days under Paragraph (A)(i) of this subdivision, and if 8 9 the deceased or missing veteran was a bona fide resident of the state at time of enlistment, induction, commissioning, 10 appointment, or drafting]. 11 SECTION 4. Section 164.002(a)(6), Natural Resources Code, 12 is amended to read as follows: 13 (6) "Veteran" has the meaning assigned by Section 14 15 161.001 [means a person who:  $[(\Lambda)(i)]$  served not less than 90 continuous days, 16 17 unless sooner discharged by reason of a service-connected disability, on active duty in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast 18 Guard, United States Public Health Service (as constituted under 42 19 U.S.C. Section 201 et seq.), or Marine Corps of the United States 20 after September 16, 1940, and who on the date of filing an 21 application for financial assistance under this chapter has not 22 been dishonorably discharged from the branch of the service in 23 24 which the person served; 25 [(ii) has at least 20 years of active or reserve military service as computed when determining the person's 26 eligibility to receive retired pay under applicable federal law; or 27

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[(iii) has enlisted or received an 1 appointment in the Texas National Guard, who has completed all 2 initial active duty training required as a condition of the 3 enlistment or appointment, and who on the date of filing the 4 5 person's application has not been dishonorably discharged from the Texas National Guard; 6 [(B) at the time of the person's enlistment, 7 induction, commissioning, appointment, or drafting was a bona fide 8 resident of this state or has resided in this state at least one 9 10 year immediately before the date of filing an application; and [(C) at the time of the person's application 11 under this chapter is a bona fide resident of this state. The term 12 includes the unmarried surviving spouse of a veteran who died or who 13 is identified as missing in action if the deceased or missing 14 15 veteran meets the requirements in this section, with the exception that the deceased or missing veteran need not have served 90 16 continuous days under Paragraph (A)(i) of this subdivision, and if 17 the deceased or missing veteran was a bona fide resident of the 18 state at the time of enlistment, induction, commissioning, 19 appointment, or drafting]. 20 SECTION 5. Sections 162.001(b) and (c) and 164.002(b), 21

22 Natural Resources Code, are repealed.

23 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
