A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 Relating to the fees of office for board members of municipal
- 3 utility districts.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 49.060, Water Code is amended to read as
- 6 follows:
- 7 Sec. 49.060. FEES OF OFFICE; REIMBURSEMENT. (a) A director is
- 8 entitled to receive fees of office of not more than \$150 a day for
- 9 each day the director actually spends performing the duties of a
- 10 director. The fees of office may not exceed \$6,000 per annum except
- 11 for:
- 12 <u>(1)</u> directors of a special water authority which is engaged
- in the distribution and sale of electric energy to the public; and
- 14 [-]
- 15 (2) directors of municipal utility districts which own and
- operate one or more water treatment plants, one or more wastewater
- 17 treatment plants, and parks and recreational facilities.
- 18 (b) Each director is also entitled to receive reimbursement of
- 19 actual expenses reasonably and necessarily incurred while engaging
- 20 in activities on behalf of the district.
- 21 (c) In order to receive fees of office and to receive
- 22 reimbursement for expenses, each director shall file with the
- 23 district a verified statement showing the number of days actually
- 24 spent in the service of the district and a general description of

- 1 the duties performed for each day of service.
- 2 (d) Instead of the fees of office and reimbursement of actual
- 3 expenses, a director may elect to receive a per diem of \$100 for
- 4 each day the director actually spends performing the duties of a
- 5 director. The total per diems received may not exceed \$6,000 per
- 6 annum except for:
- 7 <u>(1)</u> directors of a special water authority that is engaged
- 8 in the distribution and sale of electric energy to the public; and
- 9 [-]
- 10 (2) directors of municipal utility districts which own and
- operate one or more water treatment plants, one or more wastewater
- 12 treatment plants, and parks and recreational facilities.
- 13 (e) In order to receive the per diem, each director shall file with
- 14 the district a general description of the duties performed for each
- 15 day of service.
- 16 (f) $[\frac{(e)}{(e)}]$ Section 49.002 notwithstanding, in all areas of
- 17 conflict the provisions of this section shall take precedence over
- 18 all prior statutory enactments. If the enactment of this section
- 19 results in an increase in the fees of office for any district, that
- 20 district's fees of office shall not increase unless the board
- 21 adopts a resolution authorizing payment of the higher fees.
