A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to limiting the liability of volunteer fire departments
- 3 and volunteer fire fighters.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE. (a) The legislature finds
- 6 that:
- 7 (1) 80 percent of the area of this state is currently
- 8 protected by volunteer fire departments;
- 9 (2) concern regarding personal liability arising out
- 10 of services rendered by volunteer fire fighters on behalf of
- 11 volunteer fire departments deters individuals from offering their
- 12 services as volunteer fire fighters;
- 13 (3) the diminishing number of volunteer fire fighters
- 14 leads to increased costs and less service to areas of this state
- that are served by volunteer fire departments; and
- 16 (4) it is in the public interest of the citizens of
- 17 this state to encourage the continued level of service provided by
- 18 volunteer fire departments.
- 19 (b) The purpose of this Act is to reduce the exposure to
- 20 liability of:
- 21 (1) a volunteer fire department while involved in or
- 22 providing an emergency response; and
- 23 (2) a volunteer fire fighter while acting as a member
- 24 of a volunteer fire department.

- 1 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Chapter 78, Civil Practice and
- 2 Remedies Code, is amended by adding Subchapter C to read as follows:
- 3 SUBCHAPTER C. FIRE-FIGHTING SERVICES
- 4 Sec. 78.101. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 5 (1) "Emergency response" means a response involving
- 6 fire protection or prevention, rescue, emergency medical, or
- 7 <u>hazardous material response services.</u>
- 8 (2) "Volunteer fire department" means a nonprofit
- 9 organization that is:
- 10 (A) operated by its members;
- 11 (B) exempt from the state sales tax under Section
- 12 151.310, Tax Code, or the state franchise tax under Section
- 13 171.083, Tax Code; and
- 14 (C) organized to provide an emergency response.
- 15 (3) "Volunteer fire fighter" means a member of a
- 16 <u>volunteer fire department.</u>
- 17 Sec. 78.102. APPLICABILITY OF SUBCHAPTER: EMERGENCY
- 18 RESPONSE. This subchapter applies only to damages for personal
- 19 injury, death, or property damage, other than property damage to
- 20 which Subchapter A applies, arising from an error or omission of:
- 21 (1) a volunteer fire department while involved in or
- 22 providing an emergency response; or
- 23 (2) a volunteer fire fighter while involved in or
- 24 providing an emergency response as a member of a volunteer fire
- 25 department.
- Sec. 78.103. LIABILITY OF VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT. A
- 27 volunteer fire department is:

- 1 (1) liable for damages described by Section 78.102
- 2 only to the extent that a county providing the same or similar
- 3 services would be liable under Chapter 101; and
- 4 (2) entitled to the exclusions, exceptions, and
- 5 defenses applicable to a county under Chapter 101 and other
- 6 statutory or common law.
- 7 Sec. 78.104. LIABILITY OF VOLUNTEER FIRE FIGHTER. A
- 8 <u>volunteer fire fighter is:</u>
- 9 (1) liable for damages described by Section 78.102
- only to the extent that an employee providing the same or similar
- 11 services for a county would be liable; and
- 12 (2) entitled to the exclusions, exceptions,
- immunities, and defenses applicable to an employee of a county
- 14 under Chapter 101 and other statutory or common law.
- 15 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE; TRANSITION. This Act takes
- effect September 1, 2003, and applies only to a cause of action that
- 17 accrues on or after that date. An action that accrues before the
- 18 effective date of this Act is governed by the law applicable to the
- 19 action immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that
- 20 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
