3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 61.017, Labor Code, is amended to read as
5	follows:
6	Sec. 61.017. DELIVERY OF PAYMENT. (a) An employer shall

(b) An employer may pay wages by:

pay wages through a means authorized by this section.

- 9 (1) delivering them to the employee at the employee's regular place of employment during regular employment hours;
- 11 (2) delivering them to the employee at a time and place 12 agreed on by the employer and employee;
- 13 (3) sending them to the employee by registered mail, 14 to be received by the employee not later than payday;
- (4) delivering them in a manner similar to a manner specified by Subdivision (1), (2), or (3) to a person designated by the employee in writing; or
- 18 (5) delivering them to the employee by any reasonable 19 means authorized by the employee in writing.
- 20 (c) An employer may elect to pay wages to an employee who
 21 maintains at a financial institution an account that qualifies for
 22 electronic funds transfer through a direct deposit plan that uses
 23 electronic funds transfer to deposit the wages in the employee's
 24 account. An employer who desires to pay wages through a direct

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- 1 <u>deposit plan shall:</u>
- 2 (1) notify each affected employee in writing, at least
- 3 60 days before the date on which the direct deposit payroll system
- 4 is scheduled to begin, that the employer is adopting a direct
- 5 deposit payroll system; and
- 6 (2) obtain from the employee any information required
- 7 by the financial institution in which the employee maintains the
- 8 account that is necessary to implement the electronic funds
- 9 transfer.
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
