5	SECTION 1. Chapter 487, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter N to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER N. COMMUNITY TELECOMMUNICATIONS ALLIANCE PROGRAM
8	Sec. 487.601. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Community telecommunications alliance" means an
10	association of public and private entities created to share
11	resources, promote innovative school health technology, promote
12	economic development opportunities for the community, and improve
13	the overall quality of life within a local community.
14	(2) "Program" means the community telecommunications
15	alliance program.
16	Sec. 487.602. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING. (a) The office
17	and the Telecommunications Infrastructure Fund Board by rule shall
18	adopt a memorandum of understanding establishing the community
19	telecommunications alliance program. The program shall:
20	(1) assist local communities in the creation and
21	development of community telecommunications alliances by providing
22	advice and assistance to support the assessment of local demands,
23	needs, or uses of telecommunications and information services in
24	conjunction with the private sector;

1	(2) assist community telecommunications alliances in
2	applying for grant funding for projects, including:
3	(A) assisting alliances in securing matching
4	private sector funding for projects; and
5	(B) requiring alliances to develop sustainable
6	plans:
7	(i) that demonstrate how the alliance will
8	continue services once the grant funding terminates; and
9	(ii) that do not result in direct
10	competition with local businesses and telecommunications and
11	information services providers;
12	(3) assist community telecommunications alliances in
13	facilitating access to telecommunications and information services
14	for local communities to promote rural economic development; and
15	(4) create rural pilot projects to develop innovative
16	school health technology projects.
17	(b) Each community telecommunications alliance established
18	under this section shall have an advisory council with
19	representation from each of the following:
20	(1) a local nonprofit organization;
21	(2) a local county-elected official;
22	(3) a local city-elected official;
23	(4) a local telecommunications provider;
24	(5) a local economic development group;
25	(6) the local financial community; and
26	(7) a local information services provider.
27	(c) Eligibility for private network services under this

section is limited to the entities listed in Sections 58.253(a) and 1 59.072(a), Utilities Code, as appropriate. 2 (d) A community telecommunications alliance shall make 3 available the opportunity for public and school libraries, public 4 and nonprofit health care facilities, and local institutions of 5 higher education to be included in the community telecommunications 6 7 alliance. 8 Sec. 487.603. REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE. Not later than January 1 of each odd-numbered year, the office shall submit to the 9 legislature a report detailing the grant activities of the program 10 and grant recipients. The report must include: 11 12 (1) the criteria used to quantify the effect grant funds had in advancing telecommunications connectivity and 13 14 technology; 15 (2) data and performance measures used to quantify the 16 achievement of program objectives; and 17 (3) a description of and results from a grant monitoring risk assessment and on-site review process. 18 SECTION 2. Section 57.047(c), Utilities Code, is amended to 19 read as follows: 20 In awarding a grant or loan under this subchapter, the 21 (c) board shall give priority to a project or proposal that: 22 23 (1)represents collaborative efforts involving more 24 than one school, university, or library; 25 contributes matching funds from another source; (2) 26 (3) shows promise of becoming self-sustaining; 27 (4) helps users of information learn new ways to

acquire and use information through telecommunications; 1 2 extends specific educational information (5) and 3 knowledge services to a group not previously served, especially a 4 group in a rural, [or] remote, or economically depressed area; (6) results in more efficient or effective learning 5 6 than through conventional teaching; 7 improves the effectiveness and efficiency of (7) health care delivery; [or] 8 (8) takes advantage distance 9 of learning opportunities in a rural or urban school district with a: 10 11 disproportionate number of at-risk youths; (A) 12 or 13 (B) high dropout rate; or 14 (9) was developed in connection with a community 15 telecommunications alliance program created under Subchapter N, Chapter 487, Government Code. 16 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
