- Sec. 487.451. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 8

association of public and private entities created to share

- 16 Sec. 487.452. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING. (a) The office
- and the Telecommunications Infrastructure Fund Board by rule shall 17

- 4 group in a rural, remote, or economically depressed area;
- 5 (6) results in more efficient or effective learning

- 7 (7) improves the effectiveness and efficiency of
- 8 health care delivery; [ex]
- 9 (8) takes advantage of distance learning
- 10 opportunities in a rural or urban school district with a:
- 11 (A) disproportionate number of at-risk youths;

- 13 (B) high dropout rate; or
- 14 (9) was developed in connection with a community
- 15 telecommunications alliance program created under Subchapter K,
- 16 Chapter 487, Government Code.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
