A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 487, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter K to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER K. COMMUNITY TELECOMMUNICATIONS ALLIANCE PROGRAM
8	Sec. 487.451. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Community telecommunications alliance" means an
10	association of public and private entities created to share
11	resources, promote innovative school health technology, promote
12	economic development opportunities for the community, and improve
13	the overall quality of life within a local community.
14	(2) "Program" means the community telecommunications
15	alliance program.
16	Sec. 487.452. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (a) The office
17	and the Telecommunications Infrastructure Fund Board by rule shall
18	adopt a memorandum of understanding establishing the community
19	telecommunications alliance program. The program shall:
20	(1) assist local communities in the creation and
21	development of community telecommunications alliances;
22	(2) assist community telecommunications alliances in
23	applying for grant funding for projects, including:
24	(A) assisting alliances in securing matching

1	private sector funding for projects; and
2	(B) requiring alliances to develop sustainable
3	plans:
4	(i) that demonstrate how the alliance will
5	continue services once the grant funding terminates; and
6	(ii) that do not adversely affect the
7	financial stability of local businesses and telecommunications
8	providers
9	(3) assist community telecommunications alliances in
10	facilitating access to telecommunications services for local
11	communities to promote rural economic development; and
12	(4) create rural pilot projects to develop innovative
13	school health technology projects.
14	(b) Each community telecommunications alliance established
15	under this section shall have an advisory council with
16	representation from each of the following:
17	(1) a local nonprofit organization;
18	(2) a local county-elected official;
19	(3) a local city-elected official;
20	(4) a local telecommunications provider;
21	(5) a local economic development group; and
22	(6) the local financial community.
23	(c) Eligibility for private network services under this
24	section is limited to the entities listed in Sections 58.253(a) and
25	59.072(a), Utilities Code, as appropriate.
26	(d) A community telecommunications alliance shall make
27	available the opportunity for public and school libraries, public

- 1 and nonprofit health care facilities, and local institutions of
- 2 higher education to be included in the community telecommunications
- 3 alliance.
- 4 Sec. 487.453. REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE. Not later than
- 5 January 1 of each odd-numbered year, the office shall submit to the
- 6 legislature a report detailing the grant activities of the program
- 7 and grant recipients. The report must include:
- 8 (1) the criteria used to quantify the effect grant
- 9 funds had in advancing telecommunications connectivity and
- 10 technology;
- 11 (2) data and performance measures used to quantify the
- 12 <u>achievement of program objectives; and</u>
- 13 (3) a description of and results from a grant
- 14 monitoring risk assessment and on-site review process.
- SECTION 2. Section 57.047(c), Utilities Code, is amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 (c) In awarding a grant or loan under this subchapter, the
- 18 board shall give priority to a project or proposal that:
- 19 (1) represents collaborative efforts involving more
- than one school, university, or library;
- 21 (2) contributes matching funds from another source;
- 22 (3) shows promise of becoming self-sustaining;
- 23 (4) helps users of information learn new ways to
- 24 acquire and use information through telecommunications;
- 25 (5) extends specific educational information and
- 26 knowledge services to a group not previously served, especially a
- 27 group in a rural or remote area;

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- 1 (6) results in more efficient or effective learning
- 2 than through conventional teaching;
- 3 (7) improves the effectiveness and efficiency of
- 4 health care delivery; [or]
- 5 (8) takes advantage of distance learning
- 6 opportunities in a rural or urban school district with a:
- 7 (A) disproportionate number of at-risk youths;
- 8 or
- 9 (B) high dropout rate; or
- 10 (9) was developed in connection with a community
- 11 telecommunications alliance program created under Subchapter K,
- 12 <u>Chapter 487, Government Code.</u>
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
