A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to composite scoring of exit-level assessments for high

3 school graduation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 28.025, Education Code, is amended to

6 read as follows:

- 7 (a) The State Board of Education by rule shall determine
- 8 curriculum requirements for the minimum, recommended, and advanced
- 9 high school programs that are consistent with the required
- 10 curriculum under Section 28.002. A person may receive a diploma if
- 11 the person is eligible for a diploma under Section 28.0251. In
- 12 other cases, a student may graduate and receive a diploma only if:
- 13 (1) the student successfully completes the curriculum
- 14 requirements identified by the board and complies with Subsection
- 15 (f) or Section 39.025(a); or
- 16 (2) the student successfully completes an
- individualized education program developed under Section 29.005.
- 18 (b) A school district shall ensure that each student enrolls
- in the courses necessary to complete the curriculum requirements
- 20 identified by the State Board of Education under Subsection (a) for
- the recommended or advanced high school program unless the student,
- the student's parent or other person standing in parental relation
- 23 to the student, and a school counselor or school administrator
- 24 agree that the student should be permitted to take courses under the

- 1 minimum high school program.
- 2 (c) A student may graduate and receive a diploma only if:
- 3 (1) the student successfully completes the curriculum
- 4 requirements identified by the State Board of Education under
- 5 Subsection (a) and complies with Subsection (f) or Section
- 6 39.025(a); or
- 7 (2) the student successfully completes an
- 8 individualized education program developed under Section 29.005.
- 9 (d) A school district may issue a certificate of coursework
- 10 completion to a student who successfully completes the curriculum
- 11 requirements identified by the State Board of Education under
- 12 Subsection (a) but who fails to comply with Section 39.025(a). A
- 13 school district may allow a student who receives a certificate to
- 14 participate in a graduation ceremony with students receiving high
- 15 school diplomas.
- 16 (e) Each school district shall report the academic
- 17 achievement record of students who have completed a minimum,
- 18 recommended, or advanced high school program on transcript forms
- 19 adopted by the State Board of Education. The transcript forms
- 20 adopted by the board must be designed to clearly differentiate
- 21 between each of the high school programs and identify whether a
- 22 student passed all sections of the exit-level assessment, received
- 23 a diploma or a certificate of coursework completion.
- 24 (f) If fewer than 67% of all Texas 11th grade students
- 25 <u>enrolled</u> on the date of initial exit-level assessment
- 26 administration initially meet satisfactory performance
- 27 expectations on all exit-level assessments, students will have

- 1 satisfied requirements under Section 39.023 and Section 39.025(a)
- 2 if:
- 3 (1) after at least three attempts a student has not
- 4 passed all exit-level assessments as defined in Section 39.023(c);
- 5 (2) a student's score on each exit level assessment is
- 6 not lower than the passing standard on each exit assessment for the
- 7 graduating class of 2004; and
- 8 <u>(3) a student's composite score on the exit level</u>
- 9 assessments is equal to or exceeds the Transitional Statewide
- 10 Composite Exit Score.
- 11 (g) For the purposes of this subsection, the Transitional
- 12 Statewide Composite Exit Score is defined as no less than the sum or
- 13 <u>average for satisfactory performance on each exit level assessment</u>
- 14 as determined in Section 39.024(a).
- (h) Subsections (f), (g), and this subsection are sunset
- when more the 67% of all Texas 11th grade students enrolled on the
- 17 date of initial exit-level assessment administration meet
- 18 satisfactory performance expectations on all exit-level
- assessments.
- SECTION 2. Section 39.025, Education Code, is amended to
- 21 read as follows:
- 22 (a) Except as otherwise provided by Section 28.025 (f), a
- 23 [A] student may not receive a high school diploma until the student
- 24 has performed satisfactorily on the secondary exit-level
- 25 assessment instruments for English language arts, mathematics,
- social studies, and science administered under Section 39.023(c).
- 27 This subsection does not require a student to demonstrate readiness

- 1 to enroll in an institution of higher education.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
