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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to certain group benefit plans provided to certain 3 governmental officers, employees, and retirees and their dependents. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 ARTICLE 1. TEXAS SCHOOL EMPLOYEES UNIFORM GROUP HEALTH COVERAGE 6 ACT AND BENEFITS FOR SCHOOL EMPLOYEES 7 SECTION 1.01. Section 3, Article 3.50-7, Insurance Code, is 8 amended by adding Subsection (g) to read as follows: 9 (g) The trustee shall provide the group health coverage plan 10 11 under this article through a defined contribution plan. The trustee 12 may provide optional coverages offered under the program through the defined contribution plan. The trustee shall adopt rules as 13 14 necessary to implement this subsection. SECTION 1.02. Section 2(c), Article 3.50-8, Insurance Code, 15 is amended to read as follows: 16 (c) The trustee shall distribute funds under this article in 17 18 equal <u>annual</u> [monthly] installments. The trustee is entitled to recover from a school district, other educational district, 19 participating charter school, or regional education service center 20 21 any amount distributed under this article to which the district, 22 school, or service center was not entitled. 23 SECTION 1.03. Section 2(c), Article 3.50-9, Insurance Code, is amended to read as follows: 24

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(c) Amounts used as required by this section shall be
 deposited, as applicable, in [+

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3 [(1)] the Texas school employees uniform group 4 coverage trust fund established under Section 8, Article 3.50-7, of 5 this code[; or

6 [(2) another fund established for the payment of 7 employee health coverage that meets requirements for those funds 8 prescribed by the Texas Education Agency].

9 SECTION 1.04. Section 22.004(h), Education Code, is amended
10 to read as follows:

(h) An audited financial statement provided under this section must be made in accordance with rules adopted by the <u>board</u> <u>of trustees of the Teacher Retirement System of Texas</u> [commissioner of insurance or state auditor, as applicable].

ARTICLE 2. TEXAS EMPLOYEES GROUP BENEFITS ACT

16 SECTION 2.01. Section 1551.105, Insurance Code, as 17 effective June 1, 2003, is amended to read as follows:

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Sec. 1551.105. DATE AUTOMATIC COVERAGE BEGINS. Automatic coverage <u>for an employee</u> under this subchapter begins on the <u>90th</u> <u>day after the</u> date <u>the</u> [an] employee [or annuitant] becomes eligible for coverage. <u>Automatic coverage for an annuitant under</u> <u>this subchapter begins on the date the annuitant becomes eligible</u> <u>for coverage.</u>

24 SECTION 2.02. Section 1551.101(c), Insurance Code, as 25 effective June 1, 2003, is repealed.

26 SECTION 2.03. Subchapter G, Chapter 1551, Insurance Code, 27 as effective June 1, 2003, is amended by adding Section 1551.321 to

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1 read as follows: 2 Sec. 1551.321. MINIMUM CONTRIBUTION OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES. Notwithstanding Section 1551.319 or any other provision of this 3 4 chapter, a full-time employee working less than 40 hours a week shall contribute at least 50 percent of the cost of coverage 5 6 selected by the employee for the employee and at least 75 percent of the cost of coverage selected by the employee for the employee's 7 8 dependents. ARTICLE 3. TEXAS PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES GROUP BENEFITS ACT 9 SECTION 3.01. Section 1575.003(1), Insurance Code, 10 as effective June 1, 2003, is amended to read as follows: 11 (1) "Dependent" means: 12 the spouse of a retiree or active employee; 13 (A) 14 (B) an unmarried child of a retiree, active 15 employee, or deceased active employee if the child is younger than 19 [25] years of age, including: 16 17 (i) an adopted child; (ii) a foster child, stepchild, or other 18 child who is in a regular parent-child relationship; or 19 20 (iii) a recognized natural child; a retiree's or active employee's recognized 21 (C) natural child, adopted child, foster child, stepchild, or other 22 child, without regard to the age of the child, if the child is in a 23 24 regular parent-child relationship, lives with or has the child's 25 care provided by the retiree, active employee, or surviving spouse 26 on a regular basis, and is mentally retarded or physically incapacitated to an extent that the child is dependent on the 27

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1 retiree, active employee, or surviving spouse for care or support,
2 as determined by the board of trustees; or

3 (D) a deceased active employee's recognized 4 natural child, adopted child, foster child, stepchild, or other 5 child who is in a regular parent-child relationship, without regard 6 to the age of the child, if, while the active employee was alive, 7 the child:

8 (i) lived with or had the child's care9 provided by the active employee on a regular basis; and

10 (ii) was mentally retarded or physically 11 incapacitated to an extent that the child was dependent on the 12 active employee or surviving spouse for care or support, as 13 determined by the board of trustees.

SECTION 3.02. Section 1575.159, Insurance Code, as effective June 1, 2003, is amended to read as follows:

16 Sec. 1575.159. COVERAGE FOR PROSTATE-SPECIFIC ANTIGEN 17 TEST. A health benefit plan offered under the group program must 18 provide coverage for a medically accepted prostate-specific 19 antigen test used for the detection of prostate cancer for each male 20 enrolled in the plan who:

21 is at least 55 [50] years of age; or (1) is at least 35 [40] years of age and: 22 (2) has a family history of prostate cancer; or 23 (A) 24 (B) exhibits another cancer risk factor. SECTION 3.03. Section 1575.202(a), Insurance Code, 25 as 26 effective June 1, 2003, is amended to read as follows: 27 Each state fiscal year, the state shall contribute to (a)

Section 1575.203(a), 3 Insurance Code, as 4 effective June 1, 2003, is amended to read as follows: 5 Each state fiscal year, each active employee shall, as a (a) 6 condition of employment, contribute to the fund an amount equal to 7 0.5 [0.25] percent of the employee's salary. 8 SECTION 3.05. Section 1575.204, Insurance Code, as 9 effective June 1, 2003, is repealed. SECTION 3.06. Section 10 1577.101, Insurance Code, as effective June 1, 2003, is amended to read as follows: 11 Sec. 1577.101. CONTRACTS TO PROVIDE COVERAGES. 12 The board of trustees may [shall] contract with one or more carriers 13 14 authorized to provide the applicable type of insurance to provide 15 each type of coverage required by Subchapter B. ARTICLE 4. STATE UNIVERSITY EMPLOYEES 16 UNIFORM INSURANCE BENEFITS ACT 17 SECTION 4.01. Section 1601.004(a), Insurance 18 Code, as effective June 1, 2003, is amended to read as follows: 19 In this chapter, "dependent," with respect to an 20 (a) 21 individual eligible to participate in the uniform program under Section 1601.101 or 1601.102, means the individual's: 22 23 (1) spouse; 24 (2) unmarried child younger than 19 [25] years of age; 25 and (3) child of any age who lives with or has the child's 26 care provided by the individual on a regular basis if the child is 27

1 mentally retarded or physically incapacitated to the extent that 2 the child is dependent on the individual for care or support, as 3 determined by the system.

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4 SECTION 4.02. Section 1601.060(a), Insurance Code, as 5 effective June 1, 2003, is amended to read as follows:

6 (a) A carrier providing coverage purchased under this 7 chapter to a system shall provide an accounting for each line of 8 coverage to the system not later than the <u>30th</u> [120th] day after the 9 end of each <u>calendar quarter</u> [plan year].

10 SECTION 4.03. Section 1601.201, Insurance Code, as 11 effective June 1, 2003, is repealed.

12 ARTICLE 5. EFFECTIVE DATE

13 SECTION 5.01. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
