2	relating to permitting of water rights for instream uses by the
3	Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 11, Water Code, is amended
6	by adding Sections 11.0235 and 11.0236 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 11.0235. STUDY COMMISSION ON WATER RIGHTS FOR INSTREAM
8	USES. (a) In recognition of the importance that the ecological
9	vitality of our riverine, bay, and estuary systems and riparian
10	lands has on the economy, health, and well-being of the state there
11	is created the Study Commission on Water Rights for Instream Uses.
12	(b) The study commission is composed of nine members
13	appointed as follows:
14	(1) three members appointed by the lieutenant
15	governor;
16	(2) three members appointed by the speaker of the
17	house of representatives;
18	(3) the chairman of the Texas Commission on
19	Environmental Quality or the chairman's designee;
20	(4) the chairman of the Texas Water Development Board
21	or the chairman's designee; and

or the chairman's designee.

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(5) the chairman of the Parks and Wildlife Department

(c) The lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house

- 1 each shall appoint one individual who represents a river authority
- 2 or municipal water supply agency or authority, one individual who
- 3 represents an entity that is distinguished by its efforts in
- 4 resource protection, and, respectively, one senator and one member
- 5 of the house of representatives.
- 6 (d) Each appointed member of the study commission serves at
 7 the will of the person who appointed the member.
- 8 (e) The appointed senator serves as chairman.
- 9 <u>(f) A member of the study commission is not entitled to</u>
- 10 receive compensation for service on the study commission but is
- 11 entitled to reimbursement of the travel expenses incurred by the
- 12 member while conducting the business of the study commission, as
- 13 provided by the General Appropriations Act.
- 14 (g) The study commission may accept gifts and grants from
- 15 any source to be used to carry out a function of the study
- 16 <u>commission</u>.
- 17 (h) The study commission shall conduct public hearings and
- 18 study public policy implications for granting permits for instream
- 19 uses of freshwater and any other issues that the commission
- 20 determines have importance to the permitting of instream uses of
- 21 water. In evaluating the permitting of water rights for instream
- 22 uses, the study commission shall take notice of the strong public
- 23 policy imperative that exists in this state recognizing that
- 24 instream uses are important to the biological health of our parks,
- 25 game preserves, and bays and estuary systems and are high
- 26 priorities in the permitting process. The study commission shall
- 27 specifically address ways that the ecological vitality of these

1 systems will be ensured in the permitting process. 2 (i) The study commission may: 3 (1) appoint an advisory committee to assist the study 4 commission in studying a specific permitting issue; and (2) draft proposed legislation to modify existing 5 6 water-rights permitting statutes. 7 (j) Not later than December 1, 2004, the study commission 8 shall issue a report summarizing: 9 (1) any hearings conducted by the study commission; any studies conducted by the study commission; 10 (2) (3) any legislation proposed by the study commission; 11 12 and (4) any other findings and recommendations of the 13 14 study commission. (k) The study commission shall promptly deliver copies of 15 the report to the lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house. 16 17 (1) The study commission shall adopt rules to administer this section. 18 (m) The study commission is abolished and this section 19 expires June 1, 2005. 20 21 Sec. 11.0236. TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON GRANTING WATER RIGHTS 22 FOR INSTREAM USES. (a) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality may not permit water rights for instream uses until after 23

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- 1 (c) This section expires September 1, 2005.
- 2 SECTION 2. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality
- 3 shall provide staff support for the Study Commission on Water
- 4 Rights for Instream Uses created by this Act.
- 5 SECTION 3. Any permit applications pending on the effective
- 6 date of this Act shall be suspended until the moratorium on
- 7 permitting provided by Section 11.0236, Water Code, as added by
- 8 this Act, expires.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
