## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the coordination of statewide public transportation by
3	the Texas Transportation Commission and the Texas Department of
4	Transportation.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle K, Title 6, Transportation Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 461 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 461. STATEWIDE COORDINATION OF PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION
9	Sec. 461.001. LEGISLATIVE INTENT AND CONSTRUCTION. (a)
10	Public transportation services are provided in this state by many
11	different entities, both public and private. The multiplicity of
12	public transportation providers has generated inefficiencies,
13	overlaps in service, and confusion. It is the intent of this
14	chapter to eliminate waste in the provision of public
15	transportation services, to generate efficiencies that will permit
16	increased levels of service, to marshal the state's efforts to
17	reduce air pollution in major metropolitan areas, and to enable
18	public transportation providers to share resources and costs in the
19	<pre>public interest.</pre>
20	(b) This chapter shall be liberally construed to achieve its
21	purposes.
22	Sec. 461.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
23	(1) "Public transportation provider" means any entity
24	that provides public transportation services if it is a

- 1 governmental entity or if it receives financial assistance from a
- 2 governmental entity, whether state, local, or federal. The term
- 3 does not include private carriers that do not receive financial
- 4 assistance from a governmental entity.
- 5 (2) "Public transportation services" means any
- 6 conveyance of passengers and their hand-carried baggage by a
- 7 governmental entity or by a private entity if the private entity
- 8 receives financial assistance from any governmental entity. It
- 9 <u>includes</u> service provided by trains, trolleys, taxicabs,
- 10 commercial buses, special buses for the transportation of disabled
- 11 persons, intercity buses, and school buses. It does not include
- 12 intercity rail service, commercial air transportation, water
- 13 transportation, or direct service to or from a point located
- 14 outside this state.
- 15 Sec. 461.003. DUTIES OF THE TEXAS TRANSPORTATION
- 16 COMMISSION. (a) The commission by rule may require any state
- 17 agency that is responsible for ensuring the delivery of public
- 18 transportation services to contract with the department for the
- 19 department to assume all responsibilities of that agency relating
- 20 to the provision of transportation services.
- 21 (b) The commission by rule may establish consistent
- 22 accounting standards to be used by public transportation providers.
- 23 (c) The commission by rule may require any public
- 24 transportation provider to provide detailed information on its
- 25 provision of public transportation services, including revenues,
- 26 routes, maps, categories of customers served, number of customers
- 27 served, and equipment use and condition.

- 1 (d) The commission shall adopt other rules as necessary to
- 2 implement this chapter.
- 3 Sec. 461.004. DUTIES OF THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF
- 4 TRANSPORTATION. (a) The department shall identify overlaps in the
- 5 provision of public transportation services, underutilized
- 6 equipment owned by public transportation providers, and
- 7 <u>inefficiencies in the provision of public transportation services</u>
- 8 by any public transportation provider.
- 9 (b) The department may contract with any public
- 10 transportation provider for the department to provide or arrange
- 11 for the provision of public transportation services.
- 12 Sec. 461.005. ELIMINATION OF OVERLAPPING SERVICE
- 13 (a) For the purpose of eliminating waste and maximizing
- 14 efficiency, the department shall encourage public transportation
- providers to agree among themselves on the allocation of geographic
- 16 areas, routes, and categories of customers. The department may
- 17 incorporate these discussions in existing planning processes,
- 18 including the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program or
- 19 local Transportation Improvement Plans. An agreed-upon allocation
- 20 must be filed with the department in a form to be determined by the
- 21 <u>department</u>.
- 22 (b) The department may require that all or a percentage of
- 23 vehicles used to provide public transportation services meet
- 24 specified emissions standards. The standards may vary among
- 25 geographic areas based on the need of each area to reduce levels of
- 26 air pollution.
- (c) The department may issue forms to be used by public

- 1 transportation providers in making reports to the department.
- 2 Sec. 461.006. DUTIES OF PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION PROVIDERS.
- 3 (a) Public transportation providers shall cooperate with the
- 4 department in eliminating waste and ensuring efficiency and maximum
- 5 coverage in the provision of public transportation services.
- 6 (b) At the request of the department, public transportation
- 7 providers shall agree on the allocation of geographic areas,
- 8 routes, and categories of customers to eliminate waste and maximize
- 9 efficiency and shall fully implement any agreement, subject to
- 10 direction from the department.
- 11 Sec. 461.007. INCENTIVES FOR EFFICIENCY. (a)
- 12 Notwithstanding any other law, including laws establishing
- formulas for the allocation of public transportation grants, the
- 14 <u>commission may increase or reduce grants to any public</u>
- 15 transportation provider based on whether that public
- 16 <u>transportation provider is complying fully with this chapter.</u>
- 17 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, the commission may
- 18 consider whether public transportation providers in a geographic
- 19 area are complying fully with this chapter in executing its other
- 20 responsibilities regarding that area.
- 21 SECTION 2. Chapter 455.0015, Transportation Code, is
- 22 amended by adding subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 23 (c) The Texas Department of Health shall contract with the
- 24 department for the department to assume all responsibilities of the
- 25 Texas Department of Health relating to the provision of
- 26 transportation services.
- SECTION 3. Subsection (b), Section 301.063, Labor Code, is

- 1 amended by adding Subdivision (5) to read as follows:
- 2 (b) In administering this title the commission and
- 3 executive director shall:
- 4 (5) contract with the Texas Department of
- 5 Transportation for the Texas Department of Transportation to assume
- 6 all responsibilities of the commission relating to the provision of
- 7 <u>transportation services</u>.
- 8 SECTION 4. Section 40.002, Human Resources Code, is amended
- 9 by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 10 (f) The department shall contract with the Texas Department
- of Transportation for the Texas Department of Transportation to
- 12 assume all responsibilities of the department relating to the
- 13 provision of transportation services.
- 14 SECTION 5. Section 22.001, Human Resources Code, is amended
- 15 by adding subsection (e) to read as follows:
- (e) The department shall contract with the Texas Department
- 17 of Transportation for the Texas Department of Transportation to
- 18 assume all responsibilities of the department relating to the
- 19 provision of transportation services.
- 20 SECTION 6. Section 91.021, Human Resources Code, is amended
- 21 by adding subsection (g) to read as follows:
- 22 (d) The commission shall contract with the Texas Department
- 23 of Transportation for the Texas Department of Transportation to
- 24 assume all responsibilities of the commission relating to the
- 25 provision of transportation services.
- SECTION 7. Section 101.0256, Human Resources Code, is
- 27 amended by renumbering the existing text as (a) and adding

- 1 subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 2 (a) The department and the Texas Department of Human
- 3 Services shall develop standardized assessment procedures to share
- 4 information on common clients served in a similar service region.
- 5 (b) The department shall contract with the Texas Department
- 6 of Transportation for the Texas Department of Transportation to
- 7 assume all responsibilities of the department relating to the
- 8 provision of transportation services.
- 9 SECTION 8. Section 111.0525, Human Resources Code, is
- 10 amended by adding subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 11 (d) The commission shall contract with the Texas Department
- of Transportation for the Texas Department of Transportation to
- 13 assume all responsibilities of the commission relating to the
- 14 provision of transportation services.
- SECTION 9. Subsection (a), Section 461.012, Human and
- 16 Safety Code, is amended by adding Subdivision (19) to read as
- 17 follows:
- 18 (a) The commission shall:
- 19 (19) contract with the Texas Department of
- 20 Transportation for the Texas Department of Transportation to assume
- 21 all responsibilities of the commission relating to the provision of
- 22 <u>transportation services.</u>
- SECTION 10. Section 533.012, Health and Safety Code, is
- 24 amended by renumbering the existing text as (a) and adding
- 25 subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 26 (a) At the department's request, all state departments,
- 27 agencies, officers, and employees shall cooperate with the

- 1 department in activities that are consistent with their functions.
- 2 (b) The department shall contract with the Texas Department
- 3 of Transportation for the Texas Department of Transportation to
- 4 assume all responsibilities of the department relating to the
- 5 provision of transportation services.
- 6 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 7 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 8 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 9 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 10 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 12 SECTION 1.
