4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Article 5.13-2, Insurance Code, is amended by
6	adding Section 5A to read as follows:
7	Sec. 5A. FILING AND APPROVAL OF RATES FOR PROFESSIONAL
8	LIABILITY INSURANCE FOR PHYSICIANS AND HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS. (a)
9	This section applies to any insurer authorized to write
10	professional liability insurance for physicians and health care
11	providers in this state, including a Lloyd's plan, a reciprocal or
12	interinsurance exchange, the joint underwriting association
13	established under Article 21.49-3 of this code, and a
14	self-insurance trust established under Article 21.49-4 of this
15	<u>code</u> .
16	(b) Notwithstanding Section 4(b), Article 5.15-1 of this
17	code, or any other law, an insurer may not use a rate for
18	professional liability insurance for physicians or health care
19	providers before the rate is filed under Section 5 of this article
20	and approved by the commissioner. The commissioner may not approve
21	a rate under this subsection unless the rate complies with the
22	requirements of this article and Article 5.15-1 of this code.
23	(c) If the commissioner does not affirmatively approve or
24	disapprove a rate filed under this section on or before the 60th day

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1 after the date the rate is filed, the rate is considered approved on 2 the 61st day after the date the rate is filed.

3 SECTION 2. Article 21.49-4(g), Insurance Code, is repealed. 4 SECTION 3. This Act applies only to rates applicable to professional liability insurance for physicians or health care 5 6 providers that is delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed on or after January 1, 2004. Rates applicable to insurance that is 7 delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed before January 1, 2004, 8 is governed by the law as it existed immediately before the 9 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for 10 that purpose. 11

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
