5	SECTION 1. Chapter 1403, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Section 1403.003 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1403.003. SET-ASIDE FOR COLONIAS LOCATED IN RURAL
8	BORDER COUNTIES. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Border colonia" means a border colonia as defined
10	by commission rule under Section 1403.002.
11	(2) "Rural border county" means a county that:
12	(A) has a population of less than 55,000; and
13	(B) is adjacent to an international border.
14	(3) "Set-aside" means a reservation of a portion of
15	the proceeds from the sale of general obligation bonds and notes
16	under this chapter to provide financial assistance for specific
17	colonia access roadway projects proposed by rural border counties.
18	(b) The authority shall set aside an amount equal to five
19	percent of the proceeds from each sale of general obligation bonds
20	and notes under this chapter to provide financial assistance for
21	colonia access roadway projects designed to pave roads serving
22	border colonias located in rural border counties.
23	(c) The authority, as directed by the Texas Department of
24	Transportation, shall provide a grant from the set-aside on a

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priority basis to a rural border county that proposes to pave for the first time a road serving a border colonia located in that county.

4 (d) A grant under this section may be used by a rural border
5 county to purchase any materials or equipment reasonably necessary
6 to accomplish the goal of the project.

SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to proceeds from the sale of general obligation bonds and notes that are distributed under Chapter 1403, Government Code, as amended by this Act, on or after the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.

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
