| 4  | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:             |
| 5  | SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 10, Government Code, is                |
| 6  | amended by adding Chapter 2059 to read as follows:                  |
| 7  | CHAPTER 2059. CAPITOL COMPLEX MASTER PLAN TASK FORCE                |
| 8  | Sec. 2059.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "Capitol                |
| 9  | Complex" means the state-owned property in the city of Austin       |
| 10 | within the area bounded on the north by Martin Luther King, Jr.,    |
| 11 | Boulevard, on the east by Trinity Street, on the south by 10th      |
| 12 | Street, and on the west by Lavaca Street.                           |
| 13 | Sec. 2059.002. TASK FORCE. (a) The governor, the                    |
| 14 | lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of                |
| 15 | representatives shall appoint a task force to study land use within |
| 16 | the Capitol Complex.  |
| 17 | (b) The task force shall develop a master plan for the              |
| 18 | Capitol Complex that:   |
| 19 | (1) makes maximum and best use of the land within the               |
| 20 | Capitol Complex for state agencies; and                             |
| 21 | (2) provides for the relocation to the Capitol Complex              |
| 22 | of state agencies located outside the Capitol Complex.              |
| 23 | (c) The task force shall use research reports prepared by           |
| 24 | the General Services Commission and the General Land Office in      |

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| 1  | developing the master plan under Subsection (b).                     |
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| 2  | Sec. 2059.003. PRESIDING OFFICER. The governor shall                 |
| 3  | appoint one member of the task force as the presiding officer. The   |
| 4  | presiding officer shall present the master plan to the governor,     |
| 5  | the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of                 |
| 6  | representatives, and the director of any state agency that is        |
| 7  | affected by the master plan.   |
| 8  | Sec. 2059.004. AGENCY REJECTION OR APPROVAL OF                       |
| 9  | RECOMMENDATIONS. (a) The governing board of a state agency may       |
| 10 | adopt or reject the recommendations contained in the master plan.    |
| 11 | If the agency rejects the recommendations, the state agency shall    |
| 12 | specify in writing the reasons for the rejection.                    |
| 13 | (b) Not later than the 90th day after the date the task force        |
| 14 | receives a rejection of the recommendation from a state agency, the  |
| 15 | task force shall develop a new implementation strategy to present    |
| 16 | to the state agency.   |
| 17 | Sec. 2059.005. ADMINISTRATIVE AND SUPPORT STAFF. An                  |
| 18 | executive agency at the direction of the governor and a legislative  |
| 19 | agency at the direction of the lieutenant governor or the speaker of |
| 20 | the house of representatives shall provide support staff and         |
| 21 | administrative assistance to the task force.                         |
| 22 | Sec. 2059.006. APPLICABILITY OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE LAW.              |
| 23 | Chapter 2110 does not apply to the task force.                       |
| 24 | Sec. 2059.007. EXPIRATION. The task force is abolished and           |
| 25 | this chapter expires September 1, 2007.                              |
| 26 | SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives          |
| 27 | a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as    |

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provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.

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
