A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to port control of vehicle emissions.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 382, Health and Safety Code, is amended
5	by adding Subchapter H to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER H. PORT AIR QUALITY PROGRAM
7	Section 382.251. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
8	(1) "Commission" means the Texas Commission or
9	Environmental Quality.
10	(2) "Peak commuter hours" means those hours determined
11	by the commission in consultation with the owners and operators of
12	the port or navigation district and any labor union that is
13	represented at the port or navigation district.
14	Section 382.252. PORT AIR QUALITY PROGRAM. (a) Each port
15	or navigation district shall operate in a manner that does not cause
16	the engines of diesel trucks to idle or queue for more than 30
17	minutes while waiting to enter a port or navigation district.
18	(b) A port or navigation district that fails to operate in
19	the manner required by subsection (a) is liable to the state for a
20	civil penalty in the amount of \$250 for each truck that idles or
21	queues for more than 30 minutes while waiting to enter the port or
22	navigation district.
23	(c) In addition, any port or navigation district that takes

action intended to avoid or circumvent the requirements of this

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- 1 Subchapter or to avoid or circumvent the reduction of emissions of
- 2 particulate matter from idling or queuing trucks is liable to the
- 3 state for a civil penalty in the amount of \$750.
- 4 (d) Actions intended to avoid or circumvent the
- 5 requirements of this Subchapter include:
- 6 (1) diverting an idling truck to a area highways or
- 7 alternate staging areas;
- 8 (2) requiring a truck to idle or queue inside the gate
- 9 of a port or navigation district; or
- 10 (3) requiring or directing a truck driver to turn on
- 11 and off an engine while queuing.
- 12 (e) A port or navigation district does not violate the
- 13 provisions of this Subchapter by causing a truck required to idle or
- 14 queue for more than 30 minutes while waiting to enter the gate into
- a port or navigation district, if the delay is caused by:
- 16 (1) inclement weather;
- 17 (2) labor disputes;
- 18 (3) declared state and federal emergencies; or
- 19 (4) if the Commission finds that an unavoidable or
- 20 unforeseeable event caused trucks to idle and that the port or
- 21 <u>navigation district is otherwise in good faith compliance with the</u>
- 22 <u>Subchapter.</u>
- Section 382.253. EXEMPTIONS (a) Sections 382.252 (a) and
- 24 (b) do not apply to ports or navigation districts that provide two
- 25 continuous hours of uninterrupted, fully staffed receiving and
- delivery gates two hours prior to and after peak commuter hours each
- 27 day, at least five days per week. The Commission shall notify a

- 1 port or navigation district of the final determination of the peak
- 2 commuter hours.

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- 3 (b) Sections 382.252 (a) and (b) do not apply to ports or
- 4 navigation districts that operate fully staffed receiving and
- 5 delivery gates for 70 or more hours, five days per week.
- 6 (c) To qualify under Subsections (a) or (b), a port or
- 7 <u>navigation district must notify the Commission the date of</u>
- 8 implementation of the above-described measure. The port or
 - navigation district remains subject to the subchapter until the
- 10 date of implementation of such measure.
- 11 Section 382.254. ENFORCEMENT. (a) A port or navigation
- district shall be monitored by the Commission to ensure compliance
- 13 with this Subchapter.
- 14 (b) Failure to pay a civil penalty, or receipt of 3 or more
- 15 civil penalties during a 3 month period, shall result in a civil
- 16 penalty of \$2000 payable to the state.
- Section 382.255. RULES. (a) The commission shall adopt
- 18 <u>such rules and regulations necessary to administer this Subchapter</u>
- 19 as added by this Act.
- 20 (b) The commission shall determine the necessary level of
- 21 monitoring and enforcement commensurate with the level of the truck
- 22 idling problem at each port or navigation district, and adopt rules
- 23 necessary to carry out the purpose of reducing emissions of
- 24 particulate matter from idling or queuing trucks intended by this
- 25 Subchapter.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
