- 5 SECTION 1. Section 771.105, Health and Safety Code, is 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 771.105. FUNDING OF PILOT PROGRAM. (a) Money in the
- 8 9-1-1 services fee fund may be appropriated to the Texas Department
- 9 of Health to fund the pilot program.
- 10 <u>(b)</u> The department is also authorized to seek grant funding 11 for the pilot program.
- 12 (c) A political subdivision that participates in the pilot
- 13 program may pay an appropriate share of the cost of the pilot

- 15 (d) The provisions in this subchapter that require the
- 16 department to establish, conduct, and evaluate the pilot program
- 17 are contingent on the department receiving funding in accordance

- 7 SECTION 2. Section 771.108, Health and Safety Code, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 771.108. EXPIRATION. This subchapter expires
- 10 September 1, 2005 [2003].
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
