A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the imposition and use of a homeland security fee.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 171, Tax Code, is amended
5	by adding Section 171.003 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 171.003. HOMELAND SECURITY FEE SURCHARGE. (a) An
7	additional homeland security fee is imposed on each corporation
8	subject to the tax imposed by this chapter.

- 9 (b) A corporation's homeland security fee is equal to the
 10 amount computed by multiplying the corporation's net taxable earned
 11 surplus by 0.5 percent.
- 12 <u>(c) A corporation is not required to pay the homeland</u>
 13 <u>security fee for a period if the corporation is not required to pay</u>
 14 a tax for that period under Section 171.002(d).
- 15 (d) Notwithstanding Section 171.401, revenue from the fee 16 imposed by this section shall be deposited to the homeland security 17 account in the general revenue fund. Money in the homeland security 18 account may be appropriated only as follows:
- (1) one-third of the money may be appropriated only to
 the Texas Department of Health to provide funding for bioterrorism
 programs administered by the department;
- (2) one-third of the money may be appropriated only to
 the Department of Public Safety to provide funding for a grant
 program to assist local police and fire departments in funding

- 1 homeland security projects and needs as provided by Section
- 2 411.0093, Government Code; and
- 3 (3) the remainder of the money may be appropriated
- 4 only to the Texas Education Agency to provide homeland security
- 5 grants to public schools as provided by Section 7.060, Education
- 6 Code.
- 7 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 411.0093 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 411.0093. HOMELAND SECURITY GRANTS. (a) The
- 10 department shall establish a grant program to award grants to local
- 11 police and fire departments to fund local projects and needs
- 12 relating to homeland security.
- (b) The department shall use money appropriated to the
- 14 department from the homeland security account to provide funding
- 15 for the grants.
- 16 (c) In awarding grants under this section, the department
- 17 shall give priority to police and fire departments located in areas
- 18 that border the United Mexican States.
- 19 (d) The department by rule shall prescribe:
- 20 (1) an application process;
- 21 (2) eligibility criteria; and
- 22 (3) a procedure for reviewing and evaluating an
- 23 application.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 7, Education Code, is
- amended by adding Section 7.060 to read as follows:
- Sec. 7.060. HOMELAND SECURITY GRANTS. (a) The
- 27 commissioner shall establish a grant program to award grants to

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- 1 school districts to fund local projects and needs relating to
- 2 homeland security.
- 3 (b) The commissioner shall use money appropriated to the
- 4 agency from the homeland security account to provide funding for
- 5 the grants.
- 6 (c) The commissioner by rule shall prescribe:
- 7 (1) an application process;
- 8 (2) eligibility criteria; and
- 9 (3) a procedure for reviewing and evaluating an
- 10 application.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect January 1, 2004, and
- 12 applies to a report originally due on or after that date.
