8	(i) Notwithstanding Subsection (h), this section prevails
9	over a provision in Subtitle B, Title 9, that is in conflict or
10	inconsistent with this section.
11	(j) A provision in a trust created under this section that
12	relieves a trustee from a duty, responsibility, or liability
13	imposed by this section or Subtitle B, Title 9, is enforceable only
14	<u>if:</u>
15	(1) the provision is limited to specific facts and
16	circumstances unique to the property of that trust and is not
17	applicable generally to the trust; and
18	(2) the court creating or modifying the trust makes a
19	specific finding that there is clear and convincing evidence that
20	the inclusion of the provision is in the best interests of the
21	beneficiary of the trust.
22	SECTION 2. Section 868, Texas Probate Code, is amended by
23	adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
24	(c) A provision in a trust created under Section 867 that

1	relieves a trustee from a duty, responsibility, or liability
2	imposed by this subpart or Subtitle B, Title 9, Property Code, is
3	enforceable only if:
4	(1) the provision is limited to specific facts and

7	(2) the court creating or modifying the trust makes a

11	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and
12	applies only to a trust existing on or created after that date.
