A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to to an interim committee on higher education formula
- 3 funding.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that:
- 6 (1) it is vital to the economy of this state that all
- 7 areas of the state have access to quality higher education.
- 8 (2) it is in the interest of all citizens of this state
- 9 that a sufficiently funded higher education infrastructure exist
- 10 that affords its citizens opportunities to become educated and
- 11 productive members of the state's economy.
- 12 (3) the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board's
- 13 report on Closing the Gaps provides the state a blueprint for
- 14 meeting its current and future higher education needs.
- 15 SECTION 2. (a) An interim committee is established to study
- 16 higher education funding formulas. The interim committee is
- 17 composed of six members. The membership of the committee from each
- 18 chamber shall be representative of all geographic areas of the
- 19 state, who are appointed as follows:
- 20 (1) three members of the senate, appointed by the
- 21 lieutenant governor; and
- 22 (2) three members of the house of representatives,
- 23 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.
- 24 (b) The committee members shall select a presiding officer

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- 1 from among their membership and shall meet at the call of the
- 2 presiding officer.
- 3 (c) The committee shall:
- 4 (1) study the adequacy, availability, and equity of
- 5 higher education funding and its relationship to closing the gaps,
- 6 including factors such as per capita income, employment rate,
- 7 percentage age without college degrees, percentage of fall
- 8 enrollment growth and projected enrollment growth in the region
- 9 served.
- 10 (2) develop recommendations based on the study for
- 11 changes in higher education funding formulas that maximize the
- 12 states limited resources to promote a skilled and viable workforce
- and to meet the needs of our diverse state economy.
- 14 (d) Not later than November 1, 2004, the committee shall
- 15 prepare a report describing its recommendations and shall deliver
- 16 the report to the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the
- 17 house of representatives.
- 18 (e) The committee shall adopt rules to administer this
- 19 section.
- 20 (f) The committee is abolished and this section expires
- 21 September 1, 2005.
- SECTION 3. Not later than November 1, 2003, the lieutenant
- 23 governor and speaker of the house of representatives shall appoint
- 24 members to the interim committee as provided by Section 2 of this
- 25 Act.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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- 1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
