H.B. No. 3622

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation, administration, powers, duties, 3 operation, and financing of the Kingsborough Municipal Utility District No. 1 of Kaufman County. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act: 6 7 "Board" means the board of directors of the (1)8 district. (2) "Commission" means 9 the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality. 10 (3) "District" means the Kingsborough Municipal 11 Utility District No. 1 of Kaufman County. 12 13 SECTION 2. CREATION. (a) A conservation and reclamation 14 district, to be known as the Kingsborough Municipal Utility District No. 1 of Kaufman County, is created in Kaufman County, 15 subject to approval at a confirmation election under Section 13 of 16 this Act. 17 18 (b) The district is a governmental agency and a political subdivision of this state. 19 SECTION 3. AUTHORITY FOR CREATION. The district is created 20 21 under and is essential to accomplish the purposes of Section 52, 22 Article III, and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution. SECTION 4. FINDING OF BENEFIT AND PUBLIC PURPOSE. (a) The 23 24 district is created to serve a public use and benefit.

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1 (b) All of the land and other property included within the 2 boundaries of the district will be benefited by the works and 3 projects that are to be accomplished by the district under powers 4 conferred by Section 52, Article III, and Section 59, Article XVI, 5 Texas Constitution.

6 SECTION 5. BOUNDARIES. The boundaries of the district are 7 as follows:

8 BEING all that certain lot, tract or parcel of land located in 9 the J. G. Moore Survey, Abstract No. 309 and the Martha Musick 10 Survey, Abstract No. 312, Kaufman County, Texas, and being more 11 particularly described by metes and bounds as follows:

12 COMMENCING at the intersection of the of the Northeasterly 13 right-of-way line of Farm-Market 2757 (a 100 foot wide 14 right-of-way), and the Northwesterly line of said J. G. Moore 15 Survey and the Southeasterly line of said Martha Musick Survey;

16 THENCE North 44 deg. 34 min. 48 sec. East, along the common 17 line between said J. G. Moore Survey and the Martha Musick Survey, a 18 distance of 1644.55 feet, to the POINT OF BEGINNING of the herein 19 described tract of land;

East, 619.62 10 feet; South 45 deg. 21 min. 23 sec. East, a distance of 182.35 feet, to the 11 beginning of a non-tangent curve to the left having a radius of 12 2993.57 feet; 13 14 Along said non-tangent curve to the left and in a Southeasterly 15 direction, through a central angle of 04 deg. 13 min. 00 sec., an arc length of 220.31 feet, said non-tangent curve to the left also 16 17 having a long chord which bears South 47 deg. 27 min. 53 sec. East, 220.26 feet; 18 South 49 deg. 34 min. 23 sec. East, a distance of 222.84 feet, to the 19 beginning of a curve to the left having a radius of 1858.59 feet; 20 Along said curve to the left and in a Southeasterly direction, 21 through a central angle of 07 deg. 34 min. 00 sec., an arc length of 22 23 245.45 feet, said curve to the left also having a long chord which 24 bears South 53 deg. 21 min. 23 sec. East, 245.27 feet; 25 South 57 deg. 08 min. 23 sec. East, a distance of 300.24 feet, to the 26 beginning of a curve to the left having a radius of 11,472.09 feet; 27 Along said curve to the left and in a Southwesterly direction,

through a central angle of 02 deg. 58 min. 15 sec., an arc length of 594.81 feet, said curve to the left also having a long chord which bears South 55 deg. 39 min. 16 sec. East, 594.75 feet;

South 57 deg. 06 min. 23 sec. East, a distance of 327.99 feet, to the
beginning of a curve to the right having a radius of 5684.58 feet;

Along said curve to the right and in a Southeasterly direction, through a central angle of 12 deg. 08 min. 00 sec., an arc length of 1203.80 feet, said curve also having a long chord which bears South 51 deg. 02 min. 23 sec. East, 1201.56 feet;

10 South 44 deg. 58 min. 23 sec. East, a distance of 755.25 feet;

South 45 deg. 13 min. 23 sec. East, a distance of 238.92 feet, to the North corner of the Dallas East Estates which is located to the Southwest of said Farm-Market 741;

14 THENCE South 44 deg. 19 min. 24 sec. West, departing the 15 Southwesterly right-of-way line of said Farm-Market 741 and along 16 the Northwesterly boundary line of said Dallas East Addition, a 17 distance of 1401.27 feet, to the most Westerly corner of said Dallas 18 East Addition;

19 THENCE South 44 deg. 45 min. 48 sec. East, along the most 20 Southwesterly boundary line of said Dallas East Addition, a 21 distance of 1444.80 feet, to the Northwesterly right-of-way line of 22 said Farm-Market 741;

23 THENCE along the Northwesterly right-of-way line of said 24 Farm-Market 741 as follows;

25 South 44 deg. 20 min. 25 sec. West, a distance of 545.0526 feet;

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North 45 deg. 39 min. 35 sec. West, a distance of 10.00

South 44 deg. 20 min. 25 sec. West, a distance of 700.00 feet; South 45 deg. 39 min. 35 sec. East, a distance of 10.00 feet; South 44 deg. 20 min. 25 sec. West, a distance of 933.41 feet; THENCE North 49 deg. 43 min. 48 sec. East, departing the Northwesterly right-of-way line of said Farm-Market 741, a distance of 794.74 feet; THENCE North 78 deg. 41 min. 33 sec. West, a distance of 280.00 feet; THENCE North 46 deg. 19 min. 02 sec. West, a distance of 1073.59 feet; THENCE North 66 deg. 21 min. 14 sec. East, a distance of 1045.54 feet; THENCE South 81 deg. 36 min. 53 sec. West, a distance of 327.60 feet; THENCE South 72 deg. 56 min. 15 sec. West, a distance of 778.38 feet; THENCE South 87 deg. 16 min. 19 sec. West, a distance of 610.31 feet; THENCE North 77 deg. 32 min. 02 sec. West, a distance of 731.98 feet; THENCE North 58 deg. 36 min. 37 sec. West, a distance of 578.95 feet, to the POINT OF BEGINNING and containing 692.696 acres (30,173,840 square feet) of land.

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1 SECTION 6. FINDINGS RELATING TO BOUNDARIES. The 2 legislature finds that the boundaries and field notes of the 3 district form a closure. If a mistake is made in the field notes or 4 in copying the field notes in the legislative process, the mistake 5 does not affect in any way:

6 (1) the organization, existence, or validity of the 7 district;

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(2) the right of the district to impose taxes; or

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9 (3) the legality or operation of the district or the 10 board.

SECTION 7. GENERAL POWERS. (a) Except as provided by 11 Subsection (b) of this section, the district has all of the rights, 12 powers, privileges, authority, functions, and duties provided by 13 the general law of this state, including Chapters 49 and 54, Water 14 15 Code, applicable to municipal utility districts created under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution. This Act prevails 16 17 over any provision of general law that is in conflict or inconsistent with this Act. 18

(b) The district may not provide retail water service to an area designated by ordinance or resolution of the governing body of a municipality as within the water service area, extraterritorial jurisdiction, or corporate limits of that municipality if the municipality:

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(1) has a population of less than 5,000; and

25 (2) has not given its express written consent.

26 SECTION 8. ADDITIONAL POWERS. (a) The district has the 27 additional rights, powers, privileges, authority, and functions

1 provided by this section.

2 (b) To the extent authorized by Section 52, Article III, 3 Texas Constitution, the district may provide for the construction, 4 maintenance, and operation inside or outside the boundaries of the 5 district of:

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(1) paved roads and turnpikes; or

7 (2) works, facilities, or improvements related to the8 roads and turnpikes.

9 SECTION 9. BONDS. (a) The district may issue bonds as 10 provided by Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, and the general laws of 11 this state.

12 (b) The district may issue bonds, notes, or other obligations of the district to finance construction, maintenance, 13 and operation under Section 8 of this Act and may impose a tax to pay 14 15 the principal of or interest on bonds issued under this subsection.

16 (c) The district may not issue bonds under Subsection (b) of 17 this section unless the issuance is approved by a vote of a 18 two-thirds majority of the qualified voters of the district voting 19 at an election called for that purpose. Bonds, notes, or other 20 obligations issued or incurred under Subsection (b) of this section 21 may not exceed one-fourth of the assessed value of the real property 22 in the district.

(d) Sections 49.181 and 49.182, Water Code, do not apply to projects undertaken by the district under Section 8(b) of this Act or to bonds issued by the district under Subsection (b) of this section.

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SECTION 10. EMINENT DOMAIN. The district may exercise the

right of eminent domain, as provided by Section 49.222, Water Code,
 only within the boundaries of the district.

3 SECTION 11. BOARD OF DIRECTORS. (a) The district is4 governed by a board of five directors.

5 (b) Temporary directors serve until initial directors are6 elected under Section 13 of this Act.

7 (c) Initial directors serve until permanent directors are8 elected under Section 14 of this Act.

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(d) Permanent directors serve staggered four-year terms.

10 (e) Each director must qualify to serve as director in the11 manner provided by Section 49.055, Water Code.

12 SECTION 12. APPOINTMENT OF TEMPORARY DIRECTORS. (a) On or 13 after the effective date of this Act, a person who owns land in the 14 district may submit a petition to the commission requesting that 15 the commission appoint as temporary directors the five persons 16 named in the petition.

(b) Subject to Subsection (e) of this section, the commission shall appoint as temporary directors the five persons named in the first petition received by the commission.

(c) If a temporary director fails to qualify for office, thecommission shall appoint a person to fill the vacancy.

(d) As soon as practicable after all of the temporary directors have qualified, the temporary directors shall meet and elect officers from among their membership.

(e) The commission may appoint temporary directors for a district that is located wholly or in part within an area designated by ordinance or resolution of the governing body of a municipality

with a population of less than 5,000 as the water service area, 1 2 extraterritorial jurisdiction, or corporate limits of that 3 municipality only if the municipality has given its express written consent to the creation of the district. The municipality may give 4 5 its consent only on the execution of a written agreement between the developer of the district and a school district affiliated with the 6 7 municipality providing that the district will:

8 (1) fund the construction of buildings and 9 improvements for the school district; and

10 (2) establish an educational fund for the school 11 district of an amount based on an annually determined transaction 12 fee on the sale and resale of any home within the district 13 boundaries for the duration of the existence of the district.

14 SECTION 13. CONFIRMATION AND INITIAL DIRECTORS ELECTION. 15 (a) Subject to Subsection (b) of this section, the temporary board 16 of directors shall call and hold an election to confirm 17 establishment of the district and to elect five initial directors 18 in the manner provided by Chapter 49, Water Code.

The temporary board of directors may call and hold an 19 (b) election to confirm establishment of a district that is located 20 21 wholly or in part within an area designated by ordinance or resolution of the governing body of a municipality with a 22 population of less than 5,000 as the water service area, 23 24 extraterritorial jurisdiction, or corporate limits of that municipality only if the municipality has given its express written 25 26 consent to the creation of the district. The municipality may give 27 its consent only on the execution of a written agreement between the

H.B. No. 3622 1 developer of the district and a school district affiliated with the 2 municipality providing that the district will:

3 (1) fund the construction of buildings and 4 improvements for the school district; and

5 (2) establish an educational fund for the school 6 district of an amount based on an annually determined transaction 7 fee on the sale and resale of any home within the district 8 boundaries for the duration of the existence of the district.

9 SECTION 14. ELECTION OF DIRECTORS. The board shall call and 10 hold elections to elect permanent directors in the manner provided 11 by Chapter 49, Water Code.

12 SECTION 15. FINDINGS RELATED TO PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS. 13 (a) The legal notice of the intention to introduce this Act, 14 setting forth the general substance of this Act, has been published 15 as provided by law, and the notice and a copy of this Act have been 16 furnished to all persons, agencies, officials, or entities to which 17 they are required to be furnished under Section 59, Article XVI, 18 Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313, Government Code.

(b) The governor has submitted the notice and Act to thecommission.

(c) The commission has filed its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives within the required time.

(d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled
and accomplished.

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SECTION 16. EFFECTIVE DATE; EXPIRATION DATE. (a) This Act
takes effect September 1, 2003.

3 (b) If the creation of the district is not confirmed at a 4 confirmation election held under Section 13 of this Act before 5 September 1, 2005, this Act expires on that date.
