HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, An integrated, safe, and adequately financed
- 2 transportation system is a critical component of the economic,
- 3 social, and environmental well-being of both the United States and
- 4 Texas; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The Highway Trust Fund was established by the
- 6 Highway Revenue Act of 1956 as a mechanism to finance an accelerated
- 7 highway program, including the Interstate Highway System; the
- 8 revenues used to finance the trust fund are derived from federal
- 9 excise taxes on highway motor fuel and certain truck-related taxes
- 10 collected from motorists in all 50 states and paid into the federal
- 11 Highway Trust Fund; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Federal law requires that the money paid into the
- 13 trust fund be returned to the states in accordance with
- 14 legislatively established formulas that are recalculated every six
- 15 years in reauthorization legislation; most recently the
- 16 Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21) was passed
- 17 in 1998; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Due to funding disparities, 26 states, known as
- 19 highway program donor states, receive less than their fair share of
- 20 the federal fuel taxes that their citizens have paid into the
- 21 highway account of the trust fund; from 1956 to 2001, Texas received
- 22 only an average highway program rate of return of 78 percent on the
- 23 funds sent to Washington; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Currently, the United States Congress is drafting

1 legislation to reauthorize TEA-21, which guaranteed a minimum rate

of return of 90.5 percent on federal highway programs; a coalition

of the donor states seeks a guaranteed rate of return of 95 percent

4 of their share of contributions to the federal Highway Trust Fund,

calculated against all dollars being distributed to the 50 states;

13 hereby respectfully request the Congress of the United States to

provide equity funding to Texas by increasing the state's highway

15 program rate of return from the Highway Trust Fund to 95 percent of

Texas' contributions to the fund; and, be it further

17 RESOLVED, That the Texas secretary of state forward official

copies of this resolution to the president of the United States, to

the speaker of the house of representatives and the president of the

senate of the United States Congress, and to all the members of the

21 Texas delegation to the congress with the request that this

22 resolution be officially entered in the Congressional Record as a

23 memorial to the Congress of the United States of America.
