CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The Green Ribbon Project, pioneered in the Texas 2 Department of Transportation's (TxDOT) Houston District, is a 3 public-private partnership to enhance the appearance of the landscape along our public highways in urban areas by planting 4 5 trees, shrubs, and other vegetation native to Texas or adaptable to its climate; by considering local historical, social, 6 environmental characteristics; and by incorporating public art; 7 8 and WHEREAS, Rider 57, page VII-35, Chapter 1515, Acts of the 9 77th Legislature, Session, 2001 10 Regular (the General 11 Appropriations Act), states that it is the intent of the 12 legislature that TxDOT expand the Green Ribbon Project to other

WHEREAS, Rules later adopted by the Texas Transportation Commission and published in the Texas Administrative Code apply the project's principles statewide by requiring each of the 25 transportation districts to establish a Green Ribbon Master Plan that includes each city with a population greater than 100,000 and to consider that master plan when planning and designing all transportation projects; and

WHEREAS, In the case of a contract for an urban highway transportation project that is located in a nonattainment area or near nonattainment areas--as it relates to air quality--Rider 57 requires TxDOT to allocate to the transportation district an amount

areas of the state; and

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- 1 equal to not less than one-half of one percent and not more than one
- 2 percent of the amount to be spent under the contract for the
- 3 project, with at least half of the allocation to be used for the
- 4 planting of trees and other vegetation that help mitigate the
- 5 effects of air pollution; and
- 6 WHEREAS, A transportation district may spend funds allocated
- 7 for a Green Ribbon Project that are not used for the landscaping
- 8 improvements associated with a transportation project on
- 9 landscaping improvements along another urban highway located in the
- 10 same district; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Additionally, if two or more transportation
- 12 districts share an allocation, Rider 57 requires the districts to
- 13 divide the allocation according to the portion of the amount under
- 14 the contract that will be spent in each district; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The environmental and aesthetic treatment of the
- landscape along our state's highways has a history that dates back
- 17 to the 1920s when trees and shrubs were routinely salvaged and
- 18 replanted during highway construction and when bluebonnets were
- 19 sown to both control soil erosion and add aesthetics as an element
- in highway project planning; now, therefore, be it
- 21 RESOLVED, That the 78th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 22 hereby direct the Texas Department of Transportation to expand the
- 23 Green Ribbon Project statewide, according to the requirements of
- 24 Rider 57 and department rules in the Texas Administrative Code, to
- 25 enhance the appearance of the landscape along our urban public
- 26 highways; and, be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, That the Texas secretary of state forward an
