CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, According to the United States Department of Defense 1 2 there are more than 37,000 legal, permanent residents serving on 3 active duty who are or may soon be entering combat in the Persian Gulf; and 4 5 WHEREAS, It is a remarkable display of loyalty to the ideals of a democracy and freedom that these brave young men and women 6 prepare to defend our country against aggression overseas despite 7 not being recognized as U.S. citizens and not being able to share in 8

the full rights and privileges enjoyed by our fellow Americans; and
WHEREAS, The United States Congress has the opportunity to
help these brave residents gain U.S. citizenship by enacting House
Bill H.R. 1275, the Citizenship For America's Troops Act; and

13 WHEREAS, The Citizenship For America's Troops Act reduces 14 from three years to two years the amount of military service 15 required for legal, permanent residents to qualify for U.S. 16 citizenship, and exempts them from paying all of the fees required 17 by the naturalization application process; and

WHEREAS, The Citizenship For America's Troops Act also allows
the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) to conduct
citizenship interviews and oath ceremonies for military personnel
at embassies, consulates, and overseas military installations
rather than requiring such interviews and ceremonies to take place
within the United States; and

WHEREAS, On July 3, 2002, President Bush signed an executive

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- 1 order to provide expedited naturalization for aliens and noncitizen
- 2 nationals serving honorably on active-duty status in the Armed
- 3 Forces of the United States during the war on terrorism; and
- WHEREAS, The executive order designated September 11, 2001,
- 5 as the first day of a period of time in which exceptions from the
- 6 usual requirements for naturalization were initiated; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Given that this period of time has not been closed or
- 8 terminated by a related executive order, the congress should take
- 9 this window of opportunity to honor the desires of the legal,
- 10 permanent noncitizens who, in fighting global terrorism on our
- 11 behalf, have demonstrated a willingness to die for a country they
- 12 cannot yet fully claim as their own; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the 78th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 14 hereby respectfully request the Congress of the United States to
- enact House Bill H.R. 1275, the Citizenship For America's Troops
- 16 Act; and, be it further
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Texas secretary of state forward official
- 18 copies of this resolution to the president of the United States, to
- 19 the speaker of the house of representatives and the president of the
- 20 senate of the United States Congress, and to all the members of the
- 21 Texas delegation to the congress with the request that this
- 22 resolution be officially entered in the Congressional Record as a
- 23 memorial to the Congress of the United States of America.
