Hines moved to Oakland, California, with his family in 1952; he

developed a love for baseball during his early years, and his

however, that he made his mark, going undefeated in the 100-yard and

220-yard dashes during his high school career and tying the

national prep school record with a 9.4-second 100-yard dash as a

15 Houston and soon established himself as a leader on the school's

16 track team; he equaled the world record of 9.1 seconds in the

100-yard dash, and, at an Amateur Athletic Union Nationals

18 semifinal, he became the first person to break the 10-second

19 barrier in the 100-meter dash; and

WHEREAS, At the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City, Mr. Hines

21 earned a gold medal and the title "World's Fastest Human" after

winning the 100-meter dash with a time of 9.95 seconds; he also

23 anchored the men's 4x100-meter relay team, which won gold with a

24 world record time of 38.2 seconds; and
