1 WHEREAS, Jack Dale has retired from his position as sports 2 announcer for Texas Tech University, bringing to a close a 3 remarkable association with that fine institution that spanned five 4 decades; and

5 WHEREAS, A native of Kansas, he graduated from Kansas City's 6 Pathfinder School of Radio Announcing and worked at radio stations 7 in Topeka and Altus, Oklahoma, before coming to Texas in December 8 1952; and

WHEREAS, During the span between his first basketball game 9 with Texas Tech against Flagstaff State on January 6, 1953, and his 10 11 last on April 3, 2003, when the Raiders triumphed in the consolation 12 game of the 2003 National Invitational Tournament at Madison Square Garden, Mr. Dale provided color commentary or play-by-play for 13 14 approximately 1,350 men's basketball games, 520 Texas Tech or other Southwest Conference schools' football games, and nearly 50 games 15 each of Texas Tech baseball and Lady Raiders basketball; and 16

17 WHEREAS, In recognition of his enduring association with the 18 Texas Tech University athletic department, Mr. Dale was elected to 19 the Texas Tech Athletic Hall of Honor; he also received an 20 Outstanding Alumni Award from the Ex-Students Association and was 21 awarded an honorary degree from the university; and
