A JOINT RESOLUTION

proposing a constitutional amendment allowing the expenditure of motor vehicle fuel taxes and registration fees for rights-of-way for railroads and utilities.

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BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 7-a, Article VIII, Texas Constitution, 6 is amended to read as follows:

7 Sec. 7-a. Subject to legislative appropriation, allocation and direction, all net revenues remaining after payment of all 8 refunds allowed by law and expenses of collection derived from 9 motor vehicle registration fees, and all taxes, except gross 10 production and ad valorem taxes, on motor fuels and lubricants used 11 12 to propel motor vehicles over public roadways, shall be used for the of acquiring rights-of-way, 13 sole purpose constructing, 14 maintaining, and policing such public roadways, and for the administration of such laws as may be prescribed by the Legislature 15 16 pertaining to the supervision of traffic and safety on such roads; and for the purpose of planning and acquiring rights-of-way for 17 18 railroads and utilities, including pipelines, water lines, power lines, and communications lines, if the Texas Transportation 19 Commission or its successor finds that the expenditure will benefit 20 21 the state highway system; and for the payment of the principal and interest on county and road district bonds or warrants voted or 22 issued prior to January 2, 1939, and declared eligible prior to 23 January 2, 1945, for payment out of the County and Road District 24

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Highway Fund under existing law; provided, however, that one-fourth (1/4) of such net revenue from the motor fuel tax shall be allocated to the Available School Fund; and, provided, however, that the net revenue derived by counties from motor vehicle registration fees shall never be less than the maximum amounts allowed to be retained by each County and the percentage allowed to be retained by each County under the laws in effect on January 1, 1945. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as authorizing

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SECTION 2.
