A JOINT RESOLUTION

proposing a constitutional amendment to authorize the use of motor
vehicle registration fees to support trauma centers.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Section 7-a, Article VIII, Texas Constitution, 5 is amended to read as follows:

6 Sec. 7-a. Subject to legislative appropriation, allocation and direction, and except as provided in this section, all net 7 revenues remaining after payment of all refunds allowed by law and 8 expenses of collection derived from motor vehicle registration 9 fees, and all taxes, except gross production and ad valorem taxes, 10 11 on motor fuels and lubricants used to propel motor vehicles over 12 public roadways, shall be used for the sole purpose of acquiring rights-of-way, constructing, maintaining, and policing such public 13 14 roadways, and for the administration of such laws as may be prescribed by the Legislature pertaining to the supervision of 15 traffic and safety on such roads; [and] for the payment of the 16 principal and interest on county and road district bonds or 17 18 warrants voted or issued prior to January 2, 1939, and declared eligible prior to January 2, 1945, for payment out of the County and 19 Road District Highway Fund under existing law; provided, however, 20 21 that one-fourth (1/4) of such net revenue from the motor fuel tax 22 shall be allocated to the Available School Fund; and, provided, however, that the net revenue derived by counties from motor 23 vehicle registration fees shall never be less than the maximum 24

amounts allowed to be retained by each County and the percentage 1 2 allowed to be retained by each County under the laws in effect on 3 January 1, 1945. In addition to other uses authorized by this 4 section, net revenues remaining after payment of all refunds allowed by law and expenses of collection derived from motor 5 6 vehicle registration fees may be used for the purpose of supporting 7 trauma centers. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as 8 authorizing the pledging of the State's credit for any purpose.

9 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be 10 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 4, 2003. 11 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the 12 proposition: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the use of 13 motor vehicle registration fees to support trauma centers."
