WHEREAS, Residents and visitors participate in a multitude of outdoor events, including the Annual International Gumbo Cook-off in May and festivals celebrating crawfish and crabs; Orange County's heavily wooded acreage, along with marshes, grasslands, and various bodies of water, including the nearby Gulf of Mexico, attracts hunters and freshwater and saltwater fishing enthusiasts, while birders delight in the impressive range of exotic avian life;
