WHEREAS, Numerous community organizations in San Angelo benefited from Mr. Epley's staunch support; he was a great friend of the Concho Valley Boy Scouts of America, which he served in many leadership capacities and which conferred on him the Silver Beaver Award; Mr. Epley also worked with the Crockett Parent Teacher Association and sat on the board of the Children's Emergency Shelter; and
