1 WHEREAS, When the Dallas Regional Board of the
2 Anti-Defamation League presented the prestigious Henry Cohn
3 Humanitarian Award to Albert C. Black, Jr., on January 15, 2003, at
4 the Fairmont Hotel in Dallas, it was paying a great tribute to this
5 successful Dallas businessman and civic leader; and

6 WHEREAS, Born in Dallas and raised in the Frazier Courts
7 housing projects of South Dallas, Mr. Black graduated with honors
8 from W. W. Samuel High School in Dallas, received an athletic
9 scholarship to attend Eastern New Mexico University, and earned his
10 bachelor of science degree from The University of Texas at Dallas;
11 in 1995, Mr. Black garnered his master of business administration
12 degree from the Cox School of Business at Southern Methodist
13 University (SMU); and

14 WHEREAS, Mr. Black is committed to improving the inner city
15 community where he grew up; believing that business development
16 promises the best way to achieve this goal, he founded On-Target
17 Supplies & Logistics, Ltd., a successful office supply distribution
18 and service administration corporation; and

19 WHEREAS, Since 1982, he has led his corporation through
20 stages of amazing growth; On-Target Supplies & Logistics, Ltd., has
21 increased its workforce from 1 to 100 professionals, established
22 branch offices in Houston, San Antonio, and Austin, and expanded
23 its service area to include businesses throughout Texas, Oklahoma,
24 Louisiana, Arkansas, and Missouri; and

1 WHEREAS, In addition to being a successful entrepreneur,
2 Mr. Black has generously devoted countless hours to serving his
3 community, often as a liaison between the corporate world and the
4 community; a board member for the Greater Dallas Chamber of

16 such as SMU's Cox School of Business and the business school at

19 Congressional District Award for outstanding achievement in the
20 field of business, the Obelisk Award, the Citizen of the Year Award
21 from Omega Psi Phi, Ernst and Young's Entrepreneur of the Year, and
